## Hush as a Verb

### Definitions of "Hush" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "hush" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Wash by removing particles.*
- *Make (someone) be quiet or stop talking.*
- *Suppress public mention of something.*
- *Become quiet or still; fall silent.*
- *Cause to be quiet or not talk.*
- *Become quiet or quieter.*
- *Run water over the ground to erode (soil), revealing the underlying strata and valuable minerals.*
- *Be quiet.*



## Synonyms of "Hush" as a verb (28 Words)

<b>become silent</b>	Enter or assume a certain state or condition.
<b><u>conceal</u></b>	Prevent from being seen or discovered. <i>A line of sand dunes <b>concealed</b> the distant sea.</i>
<b>cover up</b>	Sit on (eggs).
<b>fall silent</b>	Pass suddenly and passively into a state of body or mind.
<b>hide</b>	Prevent from being seen or discovered. <i>Juliet s first instinct was to <b>hide</b> under the blankets.</i>
<b>hush up</b>	Become quiet or still; fall silent.
<b>keep dark</b>	Maintain in safety from injury, harm, or danger.
<b>keep quiet about</b>	Retain rights to.
<b>keep secret</b>	Behave as expected during of holidays or rites.
<b>not divulge</b>	Make known to the public information that was previously known only to a few people or that was meant to be kept a secret.
<b><u>obscure</u></b>	Make obscure or unclear. <i>None of this should <b>obscure</b> the skill and perseverance of the workers.</i>
<b>pipe down</b>	Transport by pipeline.
<b>quiesce</b>	To become quiescent to subside into.
<b>quiet</b>	Become quiet or quieter. <i>The journalists <b>quieted</b> down as Judy stepped on to the dais.</i>
<b>quiet down</b>	Become quiet or quieter.
<b>quieten</b>	Make or become quiet and calm. <i>Things seemed to have <b>quietened</b> down.</i>
<b>shush</b>	Silence someone by uttering shush. <i>Beth told her to <b>shush</b>.</i>
<b>shut up</b>	Move so that an opening or passage is obstructed; make shut.
<b>silence</b>	Prohibit or prevent from speaking. <i>The team s performance <b>silenced</b> their critics.</i>
<b><u>smother</u></b>	Deprive of the oxygen necessary for combustion. <b>Smother</b> a yawn.
<b><u>squash</u></b>	Suppress or subdue (a feeling or action). <i>I <b>squashed</b> into the middle of the crowd.</i>
<b><u>stifle</u></b>	Prevent or constrain (an activity or idea). <i>Those in the streets were <b>stifled</b> by the fumes.</i>

<b>still</b>	Make or become still quieten. <i>She raised her hand <b>stilling</b> Erica s protests.</i>
<b>stop talking</b>	Cause to stop.
<b><u>suppress</u></b>	Consciously restrain from showing; of emotions, desires, impulses, or behavior. <i>The report had been <b>suppressed</b>.</i>
<b>sweep under the carpet</b>	Make a big sweeping gesture or movement.
<b><u>veil</u></b>	Cover with a veil. <i>He wasn t able to <b>veil</b> his disappointment.</i>
<b>whitewash</b>	Cover with whitewash. <i>Most sources prefer to ignore or <b>whitewash</b> the most disturbing aspect of such reports.</i>

<b>noiseless</b>	Making no sound- Shakespeare. <i>The cycle is a <b>noiseless</b> form of transport.</i>
<b>nonviolence</b>	Peaceful resistance to a government by fasting or refusing to cooperate.
<b>pacific</b>	The largest ocean in the world. <i>A <b>pacific</b> gesture.</i>
<b>peace</b>	A treaty agreeing peace between warring states. <i>The Straits were to be open to warships in time of <b>peace</b>.</i>
<b>peaceful</b>	Peacefully resistant in response to injustice. <i>His <b>peaceful</b> mood vanished.</i>
<b><u>placid</u></b>	Not easily irritated. <i>The <b>placid</b> waters of a small lake.</i>
<b>quiescent</b>	Causing no symptoms. <i>A <b>quiescent</b> tumor.</i>
<b>quiet</b>	With little or no activity or no agitation quiet is a nonstandard variant for quietly. <i>The ringing of the telephone shattered the early morning <b>quiet</b>.</i>
<b>quietness</b>	The fact or state of abstaining from speech. <i>A voice disturbed the <b>quietness</b> of the night.</i>
<b>quietude</b>	A state of peace and quiet. <i>A moment of <b>quietude</b>.</i>
<b><u>restful</u></b>	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>The rooms were cool and <b>restful</b>.</i>
<b>reticence</b>	The trait of being uncommunicative; not volunteering anything more than necessary. <i>The traditional emotional <b>reticence</b> of the British.</i>
<b>secretiveness</b>	Characterized by a lack of openness (especially about one's actions or purposes).
<b><u>serene</u></b>	Calm, peaceful, and untroubled; tranquil. <i>A <b>serene</b> expression on her face.</i>
<b><u>serenity</u></b>	A disposition free from stress or emotion. <i>An oasis of <b>serenity</b> amidst the bustling city.</i>

<b>silence</b>	A short appointed period of time during which people stand still and do not speak as a sign of respect for a dead person or group of people. <i>We finished our meal in <b>silence</b>.</i>
<b>silent</b>	Failing to speak or communicate etc when expected to. <i>A <b>silent</b> prayer.</i>
<b>static</b>	Concerned with or producing or caused by static electricity. <i>They will probably give you a lot of <b>static</b> about your editorial.</i>
<b>stillness</b>	(poetic) tranquil silence. <i>Absolute <b>stillness</b> greeted our gaze.</i>
<b>stolid</b>	Having or revealing little emotion or sensibility; not easily aroused or excited. <i>A silent <b>stolid</b> creature who took it all as a matter of course.</i>
<b>tranquil</b>	Free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>She became more <b>tranquil</b>.</i>
<b>tranquility</b>	A state of peace and quiet.
<b>tranquilize</b>	Make calm or still.
<b>tranquillity</b>	A state of peace and quiet. <i>Passing cars are the only noise that disturbs the <b>tranquillity</b> of rural life.</i>
