homestead	Land acquired from the United States public lands by filing a record and living on and cultivating it under the homestead law.
hostess	A woman innkeeper. A game show hostess .
house	The management of a gambling house or casino. A house prefect.
<u>housing</u>	A rigid casing that encloses and protects a piece of moving or delicate equipment. A housing development.
hovel	An open shed or outhouse, used for sheltering cattle or storing grain or tools. <i>People were living in rat infested hovels.</i>
lodge	Be a lodger stay temporarily. The image had lodge d in her mind.
lodging	The act of lodging. A fee for board and lodging .
manor	 (in North America) an estate or district leased to tenants, especially one granted by royal charter in a British colony or by the Dutch governors of what is now New York State. The right to mine ores within the manor of Little Langdale.
<u>mansion</u>	A terrace or mansion block. <i>Carlyle Mansions.</i>
mews	A row or street of houses or flats that have been converted from stables or built to look like former stables. A mews house.



<u>residence</u>	A person's home, especially a large and impressive one. The youth hostel has been adapted from a private residence .
semi	A semi trailer. A three bedroomed semi .
shanty	A rhythmical work song originally sung by sailors.
<u>shelter</u>	Provide shelter for. <i>He hung back in the shelter of a rock.</i>
<u>sheltered</u>	(of a place) protected from bad weather. The plants need a shady sheltered spot in the garden.
<u>tenement</u>	A house divided into and let as separate residences.
<u>tent</u>	Live in or as if in a tent. <i>Tim tented his fingers.</i>
tepee	A Native American tent; usually of conical shape.
treetop	The upper branches and leaves of a tree or other plant.
