ad	An advertisement. <i>The latest television lager ad.</i>
advertisement	A notice or announcement in a public medium promoting a product, service, or event or publicizing a job vacancy. <i>Advertisements for alcoholic drinks.</i>
advertiser	Someone whose business is advertising. <i>Kids hate it when advertisers try too hard to target them on their level.</i>
advertising	The activity or profession of producing advertisements for commercial products or services. <i>An advertising agency.</i>
ballyhoo	Praise or publicize extravagantly. <i>A much ballyhooed musical extravaganza.</i>
banner	A flag on a pole used as the standard of a monarch, knight, or army. <i>The company was having a banner year.</i>
campaign	Go on a campaign go off to war. <i>A desert campaign.</i>
commercial	A commercially sponsored ad on radio or television. <i>They looked like a family from a breakfast cereal commercial.</i>
corporate	A corporate company or group. <i>The rules set by the corporate organization.</i>
coupon	Of a consumer collect and use coupons or vouchers offering discounts on goods or services. <i>He had a big beaming smile on his coupon.</i>
gimmick	Something unspecified whose name is either forgotten or not known. <i>I had just come from a gimmick that lasted until the early hours of the following day.</i>
handbill	A small printed advertisement or other notice distributed by hand.

marketing	The commercial processes involved in promoting and selling and distributing a product or service. <i>Does the weekly marketing at the supermarket.</i>
merchandise	Trade or traffic in (something), especially inappropriately. <i>A new breakfast food can easily be merchandised.</i>
merchandising	The activity of promoting the sale of goods, especially by their presentation in retail outlets. <i>Problems rooted in poor merchandising.</i>
playbill	A theatrical program. <i>Her name occupied third place in the playbills.</i>
product	An artifact that has been created by someone or some process. <i>A product of lime and nitric acid.</i>
promote	Of an additive act as a promoter of a catalyst. <i>They were promoted from the Third Division last season.</i>
promotional	Of or relating to advancement. <i>She was on a promotional tour for her books.</i>
publicity	The giving out of information about a product, person, or company for advertising or promotional purposes. <i>The publicity of the court room.</i>
sale	An agreement (or contract) in which property is transferred from the seller (vendor) to the buyer (vendee) for a fixed price in money (paid or agreed to be paid by the buyer). <i>The January sales got under way this week.</i>
salesclerk	A salesperson in a store.
sell	Sell all of one's property possessions or assets. <i>These books sell like hot cakes.</i>
seller	Someone who promotes or exchanges goods or services for money. <i>Street sellers of newspapers flowers etc.</i>
selling	The exchange of goods for an agreed sum of money.
shopper	A person who is shopping. <i>A commercial centre thronged with shoppers.</i>
sponsorship	The position of being a sponsor. <i>The company's sponsorship of the tournament.</i>
television	An electronic device that receives television signals and displays them on a screen. <i>She has a job in television.</i>

tout

An informer.
