## Synonyms of "Hyper" as an adjective (15 Words)

<b>crazed</b>	(of porcelain) characterized by a network of fine cracks in the glaze. <i><b>Crazed</b> china should not be used for serving food as the tiny cracks can harbour bacteria.</i>
<b>crazy</b>	(of an angle) appearing absurdly out of place or unlikely. <i>I m <b>crazy</b> about Cindy.</i>
<b>demented</b>	Behaving irrationally due to anger, distress, or excitement. <i>She was <b>demented</b> with worry.</i>
<b>frantic</b>	Conducted in a hurried, excited, and disorganized way. <i>She was <b>frantic</b> with worry.</i>
<b>frenzied</b>	Excessively agitated; distraught with fear or other violent emotion. <i>A <b>frenzied</b> attack.</i>
<b>hysterical</b>	Marked by excessive or uncontrollable emotion. <i>During <b>hysterical</b> conditions various functions of the human body are disordered.</i>

<b><u>insane</u></b>	Shocking; outrageous. <i>He had gone <b>insane</b>.</i>
<b>mad</b>	Affected with madness or insanity. <i>A <b>mad</b> whirl of pleasure.</i>
<b><u>maniacal</u></b>	Wildly disordered. <i>John burst into <b>maniacal</b> laughter.</i>
<b>manic</b>	(in psychiatry) relating to or affected by mania. <i>The <b>manic</b> interludes in depression.</i>
<b>out of one's mind</b>	Outside or external.
<b>raving</b>	Used to emphasize a particular quality. <i>Have you gone <b>raving mad</b>.</i>
<b>wild</b>	Produced from wild animals or plants without cultivation. <i>Her <b>wild</b> eyes were darting back and forth.</i>
<b>worked up</b>	Getting higher or more vigorous.
<b>wound up</b>	Put in a coil.
