### Definitions of "Icon" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “icon” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A sign which has a characteristic in common with the thing it signifies, for example the word snarl pronounced in a snarling way.*
- *A symbol or graphic representation on a screen of a program, option, or window.*
- *A graphic symbol (usually a simple picture) that denotes a program or a command or a data file or a concept in a graphical user interface.*
- *A person or thing regarded as a representative symbol or as worthy of veneration.*
- *A conventional religious painting in oil on a small wooden panel; venerated in the Eastern Church.*
- *(computer science) a graphic symbol (usually a simple picture) that denotes a program or a command or a data file or a concept in a graphical user interface.*
- *A devotional painting of Christ or another holy figure, typically executed on wood and used ceremonially in the Byzantine and other Eastern Churches.*
- *A visual representation (of an object or scene or person or abstraction) produced on a surface.*

<b>giant</b>	A person of exceptional talent or qualities. <i>Walton built a retail <b>giant</b>.</i>
<b>great</b>	A person who has achieved distinction and honor in some field. <i>The Beatles Bob Dylan all the <b>greats</b>.</i>
<a href="#"><u>idol</u></a>	A material effigy that is worshipped. <i>A soccer <b>idol</b>.</i>

<b>ikon</b>	A visual representation (of an object or scene or person or abstraction) produced on a surface.
<b>image</b>	A representation of the external form of a person or thing in art. <i>The <b>image</b> of <math>f \times x \times 2</math> is the set of all non negative real numbers if the domain of the function is the set of all real numbers.</i>
<b>likeness</b>	The semblance, guise, or outward appearance of. <i>A family <b>likeness</b> can be seen in all the boys.</i>
<b>luminary</b>	An artificial light. <i>One of the luminaries of child psychiatry.</i>
<b>model</b>	The plan for the reorganization of the Parliamentary army, passed by the House of Commons in 1644-5. <i>He was a <b>model</b> husband and father.</i>
<b>phenomenon</b>	A remarkable development. <i>The band was a pop <b>phenomenon</b> just for their sales figures alone.</i>
<b>picture</b>	A typical example of some state or quality. <i>The movie took five honours including best <b>picture</b>.</i>
<b>portrait</b>	A word picture of a person's appearance and character. <i>A <b>portrait</b> of George III.</i>
<b>representation</b>	The action of speaking or acting on behalf of someone or the state of being so represented. <i>The <b>representation</b> of women in newspapers.</i>
<b>star</b>	A star shaped symbol used to indicate a category of excellence. <i>He s a rising <b>star</b> in the party.</i>
<b>statue</b>	A sculpture representing a human or animal.
<b>superstar</b>	Someone who is dazzlingly skilled in any field. <i>He became a <b>superstar</b> overnight.</i>
<b>symbol</b>	A shape or sign used to represent something such as an organization, e.g. a red cross or a Star of David. <i>The Red Cross <b>symbol</b>.</i>

## Associations of "Icon" (30 Words)

<b><u>admiration</u></b>	A feeling of delighted approval and liking. <i>A small token in <b>admiration</b> of your works.</i>
<b>atheism</b>	A lack of belief in the existence of God or gods.
<b>boyhood</b>	The state or time of being a boy. <i>He has been passionate about cars since <b>boyhood</b>.</i>
<b>daguerreotype</b>	A photograph taken by an early photographic process employing an iodine-sensitized silvered plate and mercury vapour.
<b>devil</b>	Chief spirit of evil and adversary of God; tempter of mankind; master of Hell. <i>He was <b>deviled</b> by a new found fear.</i>
<b>film</b>	Capture on film as part of a series of moving images make a film of a story event or book. <i>Clear plastic <b>film</b> between the layers of glass.</i>

<b>gentile</b>	Relating to or indicating a nation or clan, especially a gens. <i>Christians refer to themselves as <b>gentiles</b>.</i>
<b>hero</b>	A being of great strength and courage celebrated for bold exploits; often the offspring of a mortal and a god. <i>The <b>hero</b> of Kipling's story.</i>
<b>iconoclasm</b>	The rejection or destruction of religious images as heretical; the doctrine of iconoclasts.
<b>iconoclast</b>	Someone who attacks cherished ideas or traditional institutions.
<b>iconoclastic</b>	Criticizing or attacking cherished beliefs or institutions. <i>An <b>iconoclastic</b> filmmaker who has pushed the boundaries with every film he's made.</i>
<b>idol</b>	A material effigy that is worshipped. <i>A soccer <b>idol</b>.</i>
<b>idolater</b>	A person who worships idols.
<b>idolatry</b>	Religious zeal; the willingness to serve God. <i>We must not allow our <b>idolatry</b> of art to obscure issues of political significance.</i>
<b>image</b>	(in biblical use) an idol. <i>She strives to project an <b>image</b> of youth.</i>
<b>infidel</b>	A person who does not acknowledge your god. <i>The <b>infidel</b> foe.</i>
<b>lover</b>	A person who loves someone or is loved by someone. <i>They had been <b>lovers</b> for years.</i>
<b>menu</b>	The dishes making up a meal. <i>They worked rapidly down the <b>menu</b> of reports.</i>
<b>monotheism</b>	The doctrine or belief that there is only one God.
<b>pagan</b>	Relating to pagans or their beliefs. <i>A Muslim majority had to live in close proximity to large communities of Christians and <b>pagans</b>.</i>
<b>pantheism</b>	The doctrine or belief that God is the universe and its phenomena (taken or conceived of as a whole) or the doctrine that regards the universe as a manifestation of God.
<b>paragon</b>	A person or thing regarded as a perfect example of a particular quality. <i>Your cook is a <b>paragon</b>.</i>
<b>picture</b>	Show in or as in a picture. <i>The dictionary had many <b>pictures</b>.</i>

**pixel**

(computer science) the smallest discrete component of an image or picture on a CRT screen (usually a colored dot).

*The greater the number of **pixels** per inch the greater the resolution.*

**polytheism**

The belief in or worship of more than one god.

*The **polytheism** of the ancient Near East.*

**portray**

Portray in words.

*The book **portrays** the actor as a selfish person.*

**revere**

Regard with feelings of respect and reverence consider hallowed or exalted or be in awe of.

*C zanne s still lifes were **revered** by his contemporaries.*

**veneration**

Great respect; reverence.

*His respect for the law bordered on **veneration**.*

**worship**

The activity of worshipping.

*The Maya built jungle pyramids to **worship** their gods.*
