
Identical as an Adjective

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "identical" as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- Coinciding exactly when superimposed.
- Exactly alike; incapable of being perceived as different.
- Expressing an identity.
- Having properties with uniform values along all axes.
- (of twins) derived from a single egg or ovum.
- Being the exact same one; not any other.
- Derived from a single egg or ovum.
- Similar in every detail; exactly alike.
- (of something encountered on separate occasions) the same.
- (of twins) developed from a single fertilized ovum, and therefore of the same sex and usually very similar in appearance.
