Definitions of "Identical" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “identical” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Coinciding exactly when superimposed.*
- *Exactly alike; incapable of being perceived as different.*
- *Expressing an identity.*
- *Having properties with uniform values along all axes.*
- *(of twins) derived from a single egg or ovum.*
- *Being the exact same one; not any other.*
- *Derived from a single egg or ovum.*
- *Similar in every detail; exactly alike.*
- *(of something encountered on separate occasions) the same.*
- *(of twins) developed from a single fertilized ovum, and therefore of the same sex and usually very similar in appearance.*



Synonyms of "Identical" as an adjective (17 Words)

alike	(of two or more people or things) similar to each other. <i>All politicians are alike.</i>
cut from the same cloth	With parts removed.
<u>homogeneous</u>	All of the same or similar kind or nature. <i>A close knit homogeneous group.</i>
indistinguishable	Not capable of being distinguished or differentiated. <i>The counterfeit bills were virtually indistinguishable from the real thing.</i>
<u>interchangeable</u>	Capable of replacing or changing places with something else. <i>Interchangeable parts.</i>
monovular	Derived from a single (fertilized) ovum; = "monozygotic". <i>Identical twins are monovular.</i>
one and the same	Indefinite in time or position.

selfsame	Being the exact same one; not any other. <i>Saw the selfsame quotation in two newspapers.</i>
similar	Having the same or similar characteristics. <i>They wore similar coats.</i>
superposable	Coinciding exactly when superimposed.
the same	Unchanged in character or nature.
the very	Being the exact same one; not any other.
the very same	Being the exact same one; not any other.
<u>twin</u>	Of a crystal twinned. <i>Her twin sister.</i>
undifferentiated	Not differentiated. <i>By six weeks the sexual glands are as yet undifferentiated between male and female.</i>
<u>uniform</u>	Denoting a garment forming part of a person s uniform. <i>Black uniform jackets.</i>
very	Actual; precise (used to emphasize the exact identity of someone or something). <i>On this very spot.</i>

<u>comparable</u>	Able to be likened to another; similar. <i>The situation in Holland is comparable to that in England.</i> (of a computer, piece of software, etc.) able to be used with a specified piece of equipment or software without special adaptation or modification. <i>The printer is fully compatible with all leading software.</i>

concurrent	(of three or more lines) meeting at or tending towards one point. <i>There are three concurrent art fairs around the city.</i>
conformable	Disposed or willing to comply. <i>The human adoption of practices which are conformable to biological constraints.</i>
<u>congruent</u>	Coinciding when superimposed. <i>Institutional and departmental objectives are very largely congruent.</i>
congruous	Suitable or appropriate together. <i>This explanation is congruous with earlier observations.</i>
equal	Be equal to in quality or ability. <i>He equalled the world record of 9 93 seconds.</i>
<u>equalize</u>	Level the score in a match by scoring a goal. <i>Britain is required to equalize pension rights between men and women.</i>
<u>equate</u>	Consider (one thing) to be the same as or equivalent to another. <i>That sum equates to half a million pounds today.</i>
equilateral	Having all its sides of the same length. <i>An equilateral triangle.</i>
evenhanded	Without partiality. <i>Evenhanded justice.</i>
fair	Without favoring one party in a fair evenhanded manner. <i>They set sail with a fair wind.</i>

harmonious	Tuneful; not discordant. <i>The tailored clothes were harmonious with her military bearing.</i>
<u>homogeneous</u>	Of the same kind; alike. <i>Homogeneous catalysis.</i>
indistinguishable	Not capable of being distinguished or differentiated. <i>The counterfeit bills were virtually indistinguishable from the real thing.</i>
liken	Point out the resemblance of someone or something to. <i>Racism is likened to a contagious disease.</i>
likeness	Picture consisting of a graphic image of a person or thing. <i>Her likeness to him was astonishing.</i>
match	The score needed to win a match. <i>The headdresses and bouquet were a perfect match.</i>
proportionate	Exhibiting equivalence or correspondence among constituents of an entity or between different entities. <i>Proportionate representation of a minority group.</i>
same	Similarly in the same way. <i>He put on the same costume that he had worn in Ottawa.</i>
similar	Having the same or similar characteristics. <i>He was one of those whose similar you never meet.</i>
similitude	The quality or state of being similar to something. <i>Conrad uses a range of constructions which express or imply similitude.</i>
<u>simultaneous</u>	Occurring or operating at the same time. <i>A simultaneous withdrawal of troops.</i>
<u>sync</u>	Synchronize. <i>Images flash on to your screen in sync with the music.</i>
<u>synchronize</u>	Arrange or represent events so that they co-occur. <i>You can synchronize your calendar with your GPS device and be alerted when you need to leave for an appointment.</i>
<u>tantamount</u>	Being essentially equal to something. <i>The resignations were tantamount to an admission of guilt.</i>
<u>twin</u>	A twin engined aircraft. <i>The company twinned its core business of brewing with that of distilling.</i>
