## Identical as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Identical" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “identical” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Coinciding exactly when superimposed.*
- *Exactly alike; incapable of being perceived as different.*
- *Expressing an identity.*
- *Having properties with uniform values along all axes.*
- *(of twins) derived from a single egg or ovum.*
- *Being the exact same one; not any other.*
- *Derived from a single egg or ovum.*
- *Similar in every detail; exactly alike.*
- *(of something encountered on separate occasions) the same.*
- *(of twins) developed from a single fertilized ovum, and therefore of the same sex and usually very similar in appearance.*



## Synonyms of "Identical" as an adjective (17 Words)

<b>alike</b>	(of two or more people or things) similar to each other. <i>All politicians are <b>alike</b>.</i>
<b>cut from the same cloth</b>	With parts removed.
<b><u>homogeneous</u></b>	All of the same or similar kind or nature. <i>A close knit <b>homogeneous</b> group.</i>
<b>indistinguishable</b>	Not capable of being distinguished or differentiated. <i>The counterfeit bills were virtually <b>indistinguishable</b> from the real thing.</i>
<b><u>interchangeable</u></b>	Capable of replacing or changing places with something else. <i><b>Interchangeable</b> parts.</i>
<b>monovular</b>	Derived from a single (fertilized) ovum; = "monozygotic". <i>Identical twins are <b>monovular</b>.</i>
<b>one and the same</b>	Indefinite in time or position.

<b>selfsame</b>	Being the exact same one; not any other. <i>Saw the <b>selfsame</b> quotation in two newspapers.</i>
<b>similar</b>	Having the same or similar characteristics. <i>They wore <b>similar</b> coats.</i>
<b>superposable</b>	Coinciding exactly when superimposed.
<b>the same</b>	Unchanged in character or nature.
<b>the very</b>	Being the exact same one; not any other.
<b>the very same</b>	Being the exact same one; not any other.
<b><u>twin</u></b>	Of a crystal twinned. <i>Her <b>twin</b> sister.</i>
<b>undifferentiated</b>	Not differentiated. <i>By six weeks the sexual glands are as yet <b>undifferentiated</b> between male and female.</i>
<b><u>uniform</u></b>	Denoting a garment forming part of a person's uniform. <i>Black <b>uniform</b> jackets.</i>
<b>very</b>	Actual; precise (used to emphasize the exact identity of someone or something). <i>On this <b>very</b> spot.</i>

<b>alike</b>	In a like manner. <i>The brothers were very much <b>alike</b>.</i>
<b>coincident</b>	In agreement or harmony. <i><b>Coincident</b> circles.</i>
<b><u>commensurate</u></b>	Corresponding in size or degree; in proportion. <i>Such heavy responsibility must receive <b>commensurate</b> reward.</i>
<b><u>comparable</u></b>	Able to be likened to another; similar. <i>The situation in Holland is <b>comparable</b> to that in England.</i> (of a computer, piece of software, etc.) able to be used with a specified piece of equipment or software without special adaptation or modification. <i>The printer is fully <b>compatible</b> with all leading software.</i>
<b>compatible</b>	
<b>concurrent</b>	(of three or more lines) meeting at or tending towards one point. <i>There are three <b>concurrent</b> art fairs around the city.</i>
<b>conformable</b>	Disposed or willing to comply. <i>The human adoption of practices which are <b>conformable</b> to biological constraints.</i>
<b><u>congruent</u></b>	Coinciding when superimposed. <i>Institutional and departmental objectives are very largely <b>congruent</b>.</i>
<b>congruous</b>	Suitable or appropriate together. <i>This explanation is <b>congruous</b> with earlier observations.</i>
<b>equal</b>	Be equal to in quality or ability. <i>He <b>equalled</b> the world record of 9 93 seconds.</i>
<b><u>equalize</u></b>	Level the score in a match by scoring a goal. <i>Britain is required to <b>equalize</b> pension rights between men and women.</i>
<b><u>equate</u></b>	Consider (one thing) to be the same as or equivalent to another. <i>That sum <b>equates</b> to half a million pounds today.</i>
<b>equilateral</b>	Having all its sides of the same length. <i>An <b>equilateral</b> triangle.</i>
<b>evenhanded</b>	Without partiality. <i><b>Evenhanded</b> justice.</i>
<b>fair</b>	Without favoring one party in a fair evenhanded manner. <i>They set sail with a <b>fair</b> wind.</i>

<b>harmonious</b>	Tuneful; not discordant. <i>The tailored clothes were <b>harmonious</b> with her military bearing.</i>
<b><u>homogeneous</u></b>	Of the same kind; alike. <i><b>Homogeneous</b> catalysis.</i>
<b>indistinguishable</b>	Not capable of being distinguished or differentiated. <i>The counterfeit bills were virtually <b>indistinguishable</b> from the real thing.</i>
<b>liken</b>	Point out the resemblance of someone or something to. <i>Racism is <b>likened</b> to a contagious disease.</i>
<b>likeness</b>	Picture consisting of a graphic image of a person or thing. <i>Her <b>likeness</b> to him was astonishing.</i>
<b>match</b>	The score needed to win a match. <i>The headdresses and bouquet were a perfect <b>match</b>.</i>
<b>proportionate</b>	Exhibiting equivalence or correspondence among constituents of an entity or between different entities. <i><b>Proportionate</b> representation of a minority group.</i>
<b>same</b>	Similarly in the same way. <i>He put on the <b>same</b> costume that he had worn in Ottawa.</i>
<b>similar</b>	Having the same or similar characteristics. <i>He was one of those whose <b>similar</b> you never meet.</i>
<b>similitude</b>	The quality or state of being similar to something. <i>Conrad uses a range of constructions which express or imply <b>similitude</b>.</i>
<b><u>simultaneous</u></b>	Occurring or operating at the same time. <i>A <b>simultaneous</b> withdrawal of troops.</i>
<b><u>sync</u></b>	Synchronize. <i>Images flash on to your screen in <b>sync</b> with the music.</i>
<b><u>synchronize</u></b>	Arrange or represent events so that they co-occur. <i>You can <b>synchronize</b> your calendar with your GPS device and be alerted when you need to leave for an appointment.</i>
<b><u>tantamount</u></b>	Being essentially equal to something. <i>The resignations were <b>tantamount</b> to an admission of guilt.</i>
<b><u>twin</u></b>	A twin engined aircraft. <i>The company <b>twinned</b> its core business of brewing with that of distilling.</i>
