amentia Severe congenital mental disability.

asininity The quality of being asinine; stupidity combined with stubbornness.

fatuity A ludicrous folly. **fatuousness** A ludicrous folly.

folly Foolish or senseless behavior.

Trying to drive through a blizzard is the height of **folly**.



foolhardiness The trait of giving little thought to danger.

foolishness A stupid mistake.

Adjusting to an insane society is total **foolishness**.

fruitlessness A lack of creative imagination.

Pointlessness or uselessness.

The horror and futility of war.

illogicality Invalid or incorrect reasoning.

imprudence A lack of caution in practical affairs.

. . A nonsensical remark or action.

inanity

He commented on the breathtaking inanity of the board s decision.

Behaviour or speech that is indiscreet or displays a lack of good

indiscretion judgement.

Sexual **indiscretion**s.

ineptitude Lack of skill or ability.

The officials displayed remarkable **ineptitude**.

injudiciousness The trait of being injudicious.

insanity Extreme foolishness or irrationality. *He suffered from bouts of insanity.*

irrationality The state of being irrational; lacking powers of understanding.

The **irrationality** of square roots.

A form of untrustworthiness; the trait of lacking a sense of responsibility and not feeling accountable for your actions.

The economic ills are a consequence of greed and **irresponsibility**.

lack of sense The state of needing something that is absent or unavailable.

lunacy Extreme folly or eccentricity.

It has been suggested that originality demands a degree of **lunacy**.

An acute viral disease of the nervous system of warm-blooded animals (usually transmitted by the bite of a rabid animal); rabies is fatal if the

wirus reaches the brain.

The new laws are a madness.

meaninglessness He recented the magninglessness of the test

He resented the **meaninglessness** of the tasks they assigned him.

nonsense A message that seems to convey no meaning.

She s a strong woman who stands no nonsense.

pointlessness Total lack of meaning or ideas.

rashness Any red eruption of the skin.



Lack of regard for the danger or consequences of one's actions;

<u>recklessness</u> rashness.

To fire a loaded shotgun was an act of utmost **recklessness**.

A message whose content is at variance with reason.

<u>ridiculousness</u> I recognize the sheer **ridiculousness** of being afraid of something the

size of my thumbnail.

senselessness Total lack of meaning or ideas.

silliness A ludicrous folly.

Children will love the sheer **silliness** of the enterprise.

A poor ability to understand or to profit from experience.

A comedy of infantile **stupidity**.

thoughtlessness The quality of failing to be considerate of others.
