<b>brainless</b>	Stupid; very foolish. <i>A <b>brainless</b> bimbo.</i>
<b>cockeyed</b>	Incongruous; inviting ridicule. <i>Do you expect us to believe a <b>cockeyed</b> story like that.</i>

<b>derisory</b>	Ridiculously small or inadequate. <i>His <b>derisory</b> gaze swept over her.</i>

<b>imbecile</b>	Having a mental age of three to seven years. <i>Try not to make <b>imbecile</b> remarks.</i>
<b>imbecilic</b>	Having a mental age of three to seven years.
<b>imprudent</b>	Not prudent or wise. <i>Would be <b>imprudent</b> for a noneconomist to talk about the details of economic policy.</i>
<b>incautious</b>	Lacking in caution. <i>An <b>incautious</b> remark.</i>
<b>indiscreet</b>	Having, showing, or proceeding from too great a readiness to reveal things that should remain private or secret. <i>They have been embarrassed by <b>indiscreet</b> friends.</i>
<b>injudicious</b>	Showing very poor judgement; unwise. <i>The result of an <b>injudicious</b> decision.</i>
<b>irresponsible</b>	(of a person, attitude, or action) not showing a proper sense of responsibility. <i>It would have been <b>irresponsible</b> just to drive on.</i>
<b>laughable</b>	So ludicrous as to be amusing. <i>It would have been <b>laughable</b> if it hadn't hurt so much.</i>
<b>ludicrous</b>	So unreasonable as to invite derision. <i><b>Ludicrous</b> green hair.</i>
<b>mindless</b>	Not marked by the use of reason. <i><b>Mindless</b> of the fact she was in her nightie she rushed to the door.</i>
<b>nonsensical</b>	So unreasonable as to invite derision. <i>He dismissed the claim as <b>nonsensical</b>.</i>
<b>preposterous</b>	So unreasonable as to invite derision. <i>A <b>preposterous</b> suggestion.</i>
<b>ridiculous</b>	Incongruous; inviting ridicule. <i>Her conceited assumption of universal interest in her rather dull children was <b>ridiculous</b>.</i>
<b>silly</b>	Inspiring scornful pity. <i><b>Silly</b> mid on.</i>
<b>thoughtless</b>	Without consideration of the possible consequences. <i>To think a few minutes of <b>thoughtless</b> pleasure could end in this.</i>
<b>unintelligent</b>	Having or showing a low level of intelligence. <i>A dull job with lazy and <b>unintelligent</b> co workers.</i>
<b>unreasonable</b>	Beyond the limits of acceptability or fairness. <i>An <b>unreasonable</b> request.</i>

**unwise**

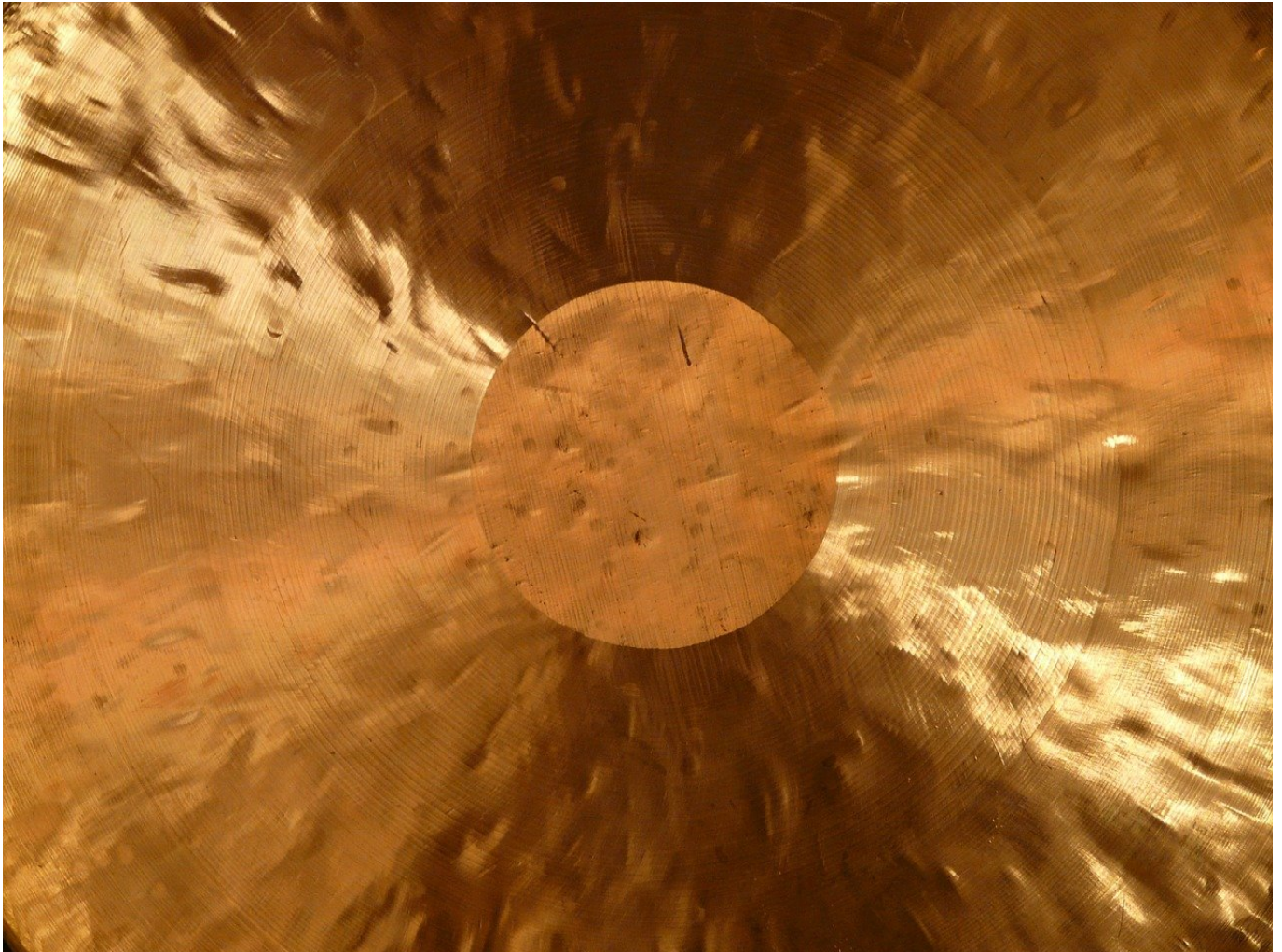
Showing or resulting from lack of judgment or wisdom.

**witless**

Foolish; stupid.

*I was scared **witless**.*

- absurdity** A message whose content is at variance with reason.  
*The crowd laughed at the **absurdity** of the clown's behavior.*
- airhead** A bridgehead seized by airborne troops.  
*She's a total **airhead**.*
- asinine** Extremely stupid or foolish.  
*Lydia ignored his **asinine** remark.*
- benighted** Lacking enlightenment or knowledge or culture.  
***Benighted** ages of barbarism and superstition.*
- dolt** A person who is not very bright.
- dullard** A slow or stupid person.  
*His **dullard** cousin.*
- dumb** Make dumb or unheard silence.  
*She stood **dumb** while he poured out a stream of abuse.*
- fatuity** A ludicrous folly.
- fatuous** Devoid of intelligence.  
*A **fatuous** comment.*

<b>folly</b>	A costly ornamental building with no practical purpose, especially a tower or mock-Gothic ruin built in a large garden or park. <i>An act of sheer <b>folly</b>.</i>
<b>fool</b>	Fool or hoax. <i>He <b>fooled</b> nightclub managers into believing he was a successful businessman.</i>
<b>foolery</b>	Silly or foolish behaviour. <i>We endured his <b>foolery</b> all afternoon.</i>
<b>foolish</b>	Having or revealing stupidity. <i><b>Foolish</b> remarks.</i>
<b>idiot</b>	A person of low intelligence.
<b>ignorance</b>	The lack of knowledge or education. <i>He acted in <b>ignorance</b> of basic procedures.</i>
<b>ignorant</b>	Lacking knowledge or awareness in general; uneducated or unsophisticated. <i>I had to walk out before I got <b>ignorant</b>.</i>
<b>imbecile</b>	Having a mental age of three to seven years. <i>Try not to make <b>imbecile</b> remarks.</i>
<b>inane</b>	Lacking sense or meaning; silly. <i>Don't badger people with <b>inane</b> questions.</i>
<b>indiscreet</b>	Having, showing, or proceeding from too great a readiness to reveal things that should remain private or secret. <i>They have been embarrassed by <b>indiscreet</b> friends.</i>
<b>patsy</b>	A person who is gullible and easy to take advantage of. <i>There is a mischievous sparkle in his eyes that suggests he is no <b>patsy</b>.</i>
<b>ridiculous</b>	Deserving or inviting derision or mockery; absurd. <i>Her conceited assumption of universal interest in her rather dull children was <b>ridiculous</b>.</i>
<b>silly</b>	A foolish person (often used as a form of address). <i><b>Silly</b> mid on.</i>
<b>stupidity</b>	Behaviour that shows a lack of good sense or judgement. <i>A comedy of infantile <b>stupidity</b>.</i>
<b>sucker</b>	Of a plant produce suckers. <i>The <b>suckers</b> run along each tentacle.</i>
<b>twit</b>	Harass with persistent criticism or carping.
<b>vacuity</b>	Total lack of meaning or ideas. <i>He denounced what he considered the frivolity or <b>vacuity</b> of much contemporary painting.</i>
