halcyon	Denoting a period of time in the past that was idyllically happy and peaceful. <i>A halcyon atmosphere.</i>
happy	Enjoying or showing or marked by joy or pleasure. <i>A happy turn of phrase.</i>
ideal	Conforming to an ultimate standard of perfection or excellence embodying an ideal. <i>This is an ideal opportunity to save money.</i>
idealized	Exalted to an ideal perfection or excellence. <i>Helen s idealized accounts of their life together.</i>

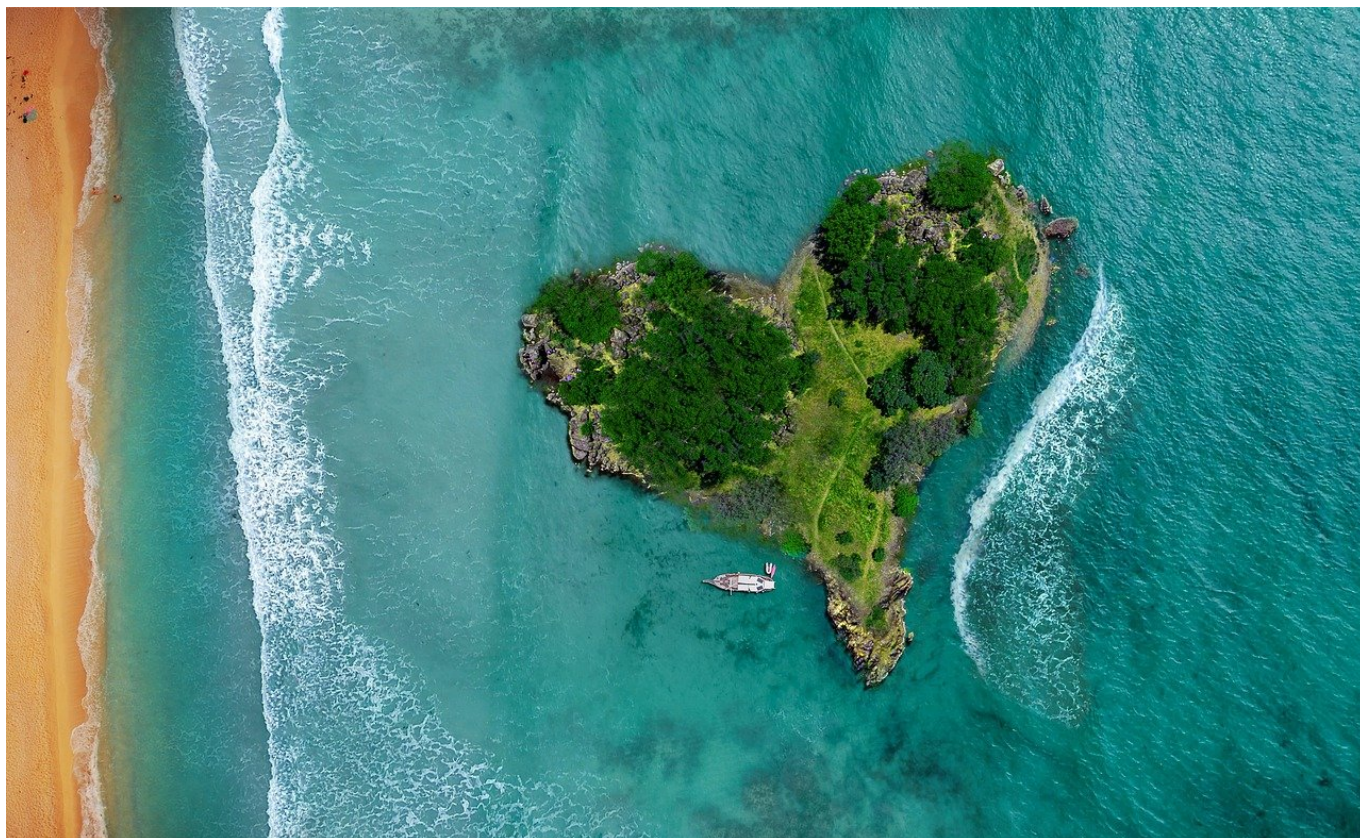
perfect Of a tense denoting a completed action or a state or habitual action which began in the past The perfect tense is formed in English with have or has and the past participle as in they have eaten and they have been eating present perfect they had eaten past perfect and they will have eaten future perfect. *All that Joseph said made **perfect** sense to me.*

wonderful Extraordinarily good or great; used especially as intensifiers. *They all think she s **wonderful**.*

Associations of "Idyllic" (30 Words)

ambience

The atmosphere of an environment.

*The relaxed **ambience** of the cocktail lounge is popular with guests.*

calm

The absence of strong emotions calm feelings.

*His voice was **calm**.*

calmness

The state or condition of being free from disturbance or violent activity.

*She exuded **calmness** and good humour.*

composed

Serenely self-possessed and free from agitation especially in times of stress.

*A very talented and **composed** young player.*

composure

The state or feeling of being calm and in control of oneself.

*He accepted their problems with **composure** and she with equanimity.*

countryside

The inhabitants of countryside areas.

*The political influence of the **countryside** remains strong.*

equanimity

Steadiness of mind under stress.

*He accepted their problems with composure and she with **equanimity**.*

halcyon	Denoting a period of time in the past that was idyllically happy and peaceful. <i>The halcyon days of the mid 1980s when profits were soaring.</i>
<u>hush</u>	Wash by removing particles. <i>He placed a finger before pursed lips to hush her.</i>
<u>imperturbable</u>	Not easily perturbed or excited or upset; marked by extreme calm and composure. <i>Hitherto imperturbable he now showed signs of alarm.</i>
noiseless	Making no sound- Shakespeare. <i>The cycle is a noiseless form of transport.</i>
nonviolence	Peaceful resistance to a government by fasting or refusing to cooperate.
nonviolent	Abstaining (on principle) from the use of violence.
pacific	A steam locomotive of 4-6-2 wheel arrangement. <i>The pacific temper seeks to settle disputes on grounds of justice rather than by force.</i>
peace	A treaty agreeing peace between warring states. <i>He was arrested for disturbing the peace.</i>
peaceful	Peacefully resistant in response to injustice. <i>Peaceful sleep.</i>
peacetime	A period when a country is not at war. <i>In peacetime regiments were billeted upon towns and villages.</i>
<u>placid</u>	Not easily upset or excited. <i>Remained placid despite the repeated delays.</i>
quietude	A state of stillness, calmness, and quiet in a person or place. <i>It highlights her quietude and wise passivity.</i>
<u>restful</u>	Affording physical or mental rest. <i>She spent a restful night at home.</i>
<u>rural</u>	Living in or characteristic of farming or country life. <i>Rural people.</i>
<u>rustic</u>	Characteristic of rural life. <i>A rustic bridge.</i>
<u>serene</u>	Completely clear and fine. <i>Her eyes were closed and she looked very serene.</i>
<u>serenity</u>	The absence of mental stress or anxiety. <i>An oasis of serenity amidst the bustling city.</i>
<u>stillness</u>	Tranquil silence. <i>Absolute stillness greeted our gaze.</i>

tranquil

Not agitated; without losing self-possession.
*Her **tranquil** gaze.*

tranquility

An untroubled state; free from disturbances.

tranquillity

The quality or state of being tranquil; calm.

*Passing cars are the only noise that disturbs the **tranquillity** of rural life.*

unarmed

Not having or using arms.

*He was shooting **unarmed** civilians.*

unflappable

Having or showing calmness in a crisis.

*Self contained **unflappable** Glaswegian common sense.*
