Associations of "Ill informed" (30 Words)

ailment	An illness, typically a minor one. <i>The doctor diagnosed a common stomach ailment.</i>
bipolar	Of a person suffering from bipolar disorder. <i>A sharply bipolar division of affluent and underclass.</i>
catching	The act of detecting something catching sight of something. <i>Chicken pox is catching until scabs form on all the blisters.</i>
contagious	Capable of being transmitted by infection. <i>A contagious disease.</i>
delayed	Not as far along as normal in development.
disease	A particular quality or disposition regarded as adversely affecting a person or group of people. <i>Bacterial meningitis is quite a rare disease.</i>
disturbed	Emotionally unstable and having difficulty coping with personal relationships. <i>The treatment of disturbed children.</i>
dizzy	Make dizzy or giddy. <i>A dizzy range of hues.</i>
flu	Influenza. <i>She was in bed with flu.</i>
hospital	A health facility where patients receive treatment. <i>Christ's Hospital.</i>
illness	A disease or period of sickness affecting the body or mind. <i>He died after a long illness.</i>
infection	(international law) illegality that taints or contaminates a ship or cargo rendering it liable to seizure. <i>Strict hygiene will limit the risk of infection.</i>

infectious	Easily spread- Bertrand Russell. <i>A highly infectious virus.</i>
mad	Affected with madness or insanity. <i>Another myth is that Scorpios are sex mad.</i>
migraine	A recurrent throbbing headache that typically affects one side of the head and is often accompanied by nausea and disturbed vision. <i>An attack of migraine.</i>
neurotic	A neurotic person. <i>I wasn't going to be labelled as a hypochondriac or neurotic.</i>
pandemic	An outbreak of a pandemic disease. <i>A pandemic outbreak of malaria.</i>
paroxysm	A sudden recurrence or attack of a disease. <i>A paroxysm of weeping.</i>
patient	Able to accept or tolerate delays, problems, or suffering without becoming annoyed or anxious. <i>The number of emergency patients has grown rapidly.</i>
plague	A contagious bacterial disease characterized by fever and delirium typically with the formation of buboes bubonic plague and sometimes infection of the lungs pneumonic plague. <i>He has been plagued by ill health.</i>
polio	An acute viral disease marked by inflammation of nerve cells of the brain stem and spinal cord.
sars	A respiratory disease of unknown etiology that apparently originated in mainland China in 2003; characterized by fever and coughing or difficulty breathing or hypoxia; can be fatal.
schizophrenia	(in general use) a mentality or approach characterized by inconsistent or contradictory elements. <i>Gibraltar's schizophrenia continues to be fed by colonial pride.</i>
septic	Denoting a drainage system incorporating a septic tank. <i>A septic sore throat.</i>
sick	People who are sick. <i>Sick of it all.</i>
sickness	The state of being ill. <i>She felt a wave of sickness wash over her.</i>
smallpox	A highly contagious viral disease characterized by fever and weakness and skin eruption with pustules that form scabs that slough off leaving scars.
transmissible	(of disease) capable of being transmitted by infection. <i>Transmissible tradition.</i>
