## Associations of "Imagining" (30 Words)

<a href="#">assumed</a>	Adopted as a basis of reasoning; expected. <i>An <b>assumed</b> cheerfulness.</i>
<a href="#">assuming</a>	Excessively forward. <i>On a subject like this it would be too <b>assuming</b> for me to decide.</i>
<a href="#">assumption</a>	The taking up of the body and soul of the Virgin Mary when her earthly life had ended. <i>On the <b>assumption</b> that he has been injured we can infer that he will not play.</i>
<a href="#">conceivable</a>	Capable of being imagined or grasped mentally. <i>The body was photographed from every <b>conceivable</b> angle.</i>
<a href="#">conjecture</a>	(in textual criticism) propose (a reading). <i>A matter for <b>conjecture</b>.</i>
<a href="#">daydream</a>	Have a daydream indulge in a fantasy. <i>She looked out the window <b>daydreaming</b>.</i>
<a href="#">envisage</a>	Form a mental picture of (something not yet existing or known). <i>The Rome Treaty <b>envisaged</b> free movement across frontiers.</i>
<a href="#">envision</a>	Imagine; conceive of; see in one's mind. <i>She <b>envisioned</b> the admiring glances of guests seeing her home.</i>
<a href="#">fancied</a>	Formed or conceived by the imagination. <i>A <b>fancied</b> wrong.</i>
<a href="#">fantasy</a>	Indulge in fantasies. <i>A schoolgirl <b>fantasy</b>.</i>
<a href="#">fictitious</a>	Occurring in or invented for fiction. <i>A <b>fictitious</b> address.</i>
<a href="#">guess</a>	Put forward of a guess in spite of possible refutation. <i>I <b>guess</b> she is angry at me for standing her up.</i>

<b>hypothesis</b>	A supposition or proposed explanation made on the basis of limited evidence as a starting point for further investigation. <i>His steady state <b>hypothesis</b> of the origin of the universe.</i>
	Put (something) forward as a hypothesis.
<b>hypothesize</b>	<i>Lack of cushioning in shoes has been <b>hypothesized</b> as a cause of running injuries.</i>
<b>hypothetical</b>	A hypothetical possibility circumstance statement proposal situation etc. <i>Let us take a <b>hypothetical</b> case.</i>
<b>ideational</b>	Relating to the formation of ideas or concepts. <i>Policy has been shaped by both material and <b>ideational</b> factors.</i>
<b>illusory</b>	Based on illusion; not real. <i>She knew the safety of her room was <b>illusory</b>.</i>
<b>improbably</b>	Not easy to believe. <i>Monasteries perch <b>improbably</b> on crags and cliff tops.</i>
<b>maybe</b>	By chance. <i>He was standing <b>maybe</b> 20 or 30 feet away.</i>
<b>presumably</b>	Used to convey that what is asserted is very likely though not known for certain. <i>It was not yet ten o'clock so <b>presumably</b> the boys were still at the pub.</i>
<b>presume</b>	Take upon oneself; act presumptuously, without permission. <i>Forgive me if I have <b>presumed</b>.</i>
<b>presuppose</b>	Require as a necessary antecedent or precondition. <i>This step <b>presupposes</b> two prior ones.</i>
<b>scenario</b>	A setting, in particular for a work of art or literature. <i>The <b>scenario</b> is World War Two.</i>
<b>speculate</b>	Form a theory or conjecture about a subject without firm evidence. <i>He didn't look as though he had the money to <b>speculate</b> in shares.</i>
<b>suppose</b>	Expect believe or suppose. <i><b>Suppose</b> he had been murdered what then.</i>
<b>supposedly</b>	Believed or reputed to be the case. <i>There were rumours of a rift between him and his colleagues <b>supposedly</b> because they were jealous of his relationship with the Duchess.</i>
<b>theoretical</b>	Concerned primarily with theories or hypotheses rather than practical considerations. <i>The training is practical rather than <b>theoretical</b>.</i>
<b>theorize</b>	Create a theoretical premise or framework for. <i>Galileo <b>theorized</b> the motion of the stars.</i>

A person given to fanciful speculations and enthusiasms with little regard for what is actually possible.

**visualize**

Make (something) visible to the eye.
