conceivable Capable of being imagined or grasped mentally.

Have a daydream indulge in a fantasy.

daydream

She looked out the window daydreaming.

envisageForm a mental picture of (something not yet existing or known.

The Rome Treaty **envisage**d free movement across frontiers.

envision Imagine; conceive of; see in one's mind.

She **envision**ed the admiring glances of guests seeing her home.

fancied Formed or conceived by the imagination.

A **fancied** wrong.

fantasy Indulge in fantasies. *A schoolgirl fantasy.*

Occurring in or invented for fiction.

fictitious A fictitious address.

guessPut forward of a guess in spite of possible refutation.

I **quess** she is anary at me for standing her up.



A supposition or proposed explanation made on the basis of limited evidence

hypothesis as a starting point for further investigation.

His steady state **hypothesis** of the origin of the universe.

Put (something) forward as a hypothesis.

hypothesize Lack of cushioning in shoes has been **hypothesize**d as a cause of running

injuries.

hypothetical A hypothetical possibility circumstance statement proposal situation etc.

Let us take a **hypothetical** case.

Relating to the formation of ideas or concepts. ideational

Policy has been shaped by both material and **ideational** factors.

Based on illusion; not real. illusory

She knew the safety of her room was illusory.

Not easy to believe. improbably

Monasteries perch **improbably** on crags and cliff tops.

By chance.

maybe He was standing **maybe** 20 or 30 feet away.

Used to convey that what is asserted is very likely though not known for

presumably certain.

It was not yet ten o clock so **presumably** the boys were still at the pub.

Take upon oneself; act presumptuously, without permission.

presume Forgive me if I have **presume**d.

Require as a necessary antecedent or precondition. presuppose

This step **presuppose**s two prior ones.

A setting, in particular for a work of art or literature. scenario

The **scenario** is World War Two.

Form a theory or conjecture about a subject without firm evidence. **speculate**

He didn t look as though he had the money to **speculate** in shares.

Expect believe or suppose. **suppose**

Suppose he had been murdered what then.

Believed or reputed to be the case.

There were rumours of a rift between him and his colleagues **supposedly supposedly**

because they were jealous of his relationship with the Duchess.

Concerned primarily with theories or hypotheses rather than practical

theoretical considerations.

The training is practical rather than **theoretical**.

Create a theoretical premise or framework for. theorize

Galileo **theorize**d the motion of the stars.



A person given to fanciful speculations and enthusiasms with little regard for

visionary what is actually possible.

Visionary dreams.

wisualize

Make (something) visible to the eye.

With this machine ultrasound can be **visualize**d.
