**lopsidedness** An oblique or slanting asymmetry.

misproportion A lack of proportion.

polarity

A relation between two opposite attributes or tendencies.

It exhibits **polarity** when presented to a magnetic needle.

**unbalance** A state of mental disturbance and disorientation.

There appears to be very little horizontal stress **unbalance**.

**unevenness** The quality of being uneven and lacking uniformity.

variance An activity that varies from a norm or standard.

A zoning **variance**.

**variation** Something a little different from others of the same type.

The figures showed marked **variation** from year to year.
