## Associations of "Imbued" (30 Words)

<b>achromatic</b>	Relating to, using, or denoting lenses that transmit light without separating it into constituent colours. <i>The <b>achromatic</b> gloom.</i>
<b>azure</b>	Color azure. <i>White beaches surrounded by <b>azure</b> seas.</i>
<b>color</b>	Decorate with colors. <i>The situation soon took on a different <b>color</b>.</i>
<b>complexion</b>	A point of view or general attitude or inclination. <i>Diphthongs are <b>complexions</b> of vowels.</i>
<a href="#">diffuse</a>	Spread or diffuse through. <i>The problem is how to <b>diffuse</b> power without creating anarchy.</i>
<a href="#">diffusion</a>	The dissemination of elements of culture to another region or people. <i>The rate of <b>diffusion</b> of a gas.</i>
<b>discolor</b>	Cause to lose or change color. <i>The shirts <b>discolored</b>.</i>
<a href="#">disseminate</a>	Spread throughout an organ or the body. <i>There is a subset of these low grade tumours that can <b>disseminate</b> and migrate.</i>
<b>dissipate</b>	Spend frivolously and unwisely. <i>He wanted to <b>dissipate</b> his anger.</i>
<b>filter</b>	A traffic light signalling a filter arrangement. <i><b>Filters</b> can be used in photography to reduce haze.</i>
<b>growing</b>	Biology the process of an individual organism growing organically a purely biological unfolding of events involved in an organism changing gradually from a simple to a more complex level. <i>The <b>growing</b> concern over ozone levels.</i>
<a href="#">hue</a>	A colour or shade. <i>Verdigris is greenish yellow in <b>hue</b>.</i>

<b>leach</b>	Cause a liquid to leach or percolate. <i>The nutrient is quickly <b>leached</b> away.</i>
<b><u>lightness</u></b>	The visual effect of illumination on objects or scenes as created in pictures. <i>The glass adds <b>lightness</b> to the room.</i>
<b>percolate</b>	Gain or regain energy. <i>He put some coffee on to <b>percolate</b>.</i>
<b>perfuse</b>	Force a fluid through (a body part or tissue). <i>The isolated <b>perfused</b> rat liver.</i>
<b><u>permeate</u></b>	Pass through. <i>Water <b>permeates</b> sand easily.</i>
<b><u>pervade</u></b>	Spread or diffuse through. <i>The sense of crisis which <b>pervaded</b> Europe in the 1930s.</i>
<b>pigmentation</b>	The deposition of pigment in animals or plants or human beings.
<b>polychrome</b>	Color with many colors make polychrome. <i>Painters gilded and <b>polychromed</b> the wooden carvings.</i>
<b><u>purple</u></b>	In ancient Rome or Byzantium clothing made from fabric dyed with Tyrian purple. <i>A writer of <b>empurpled</b> literature.</i>
<b>roseate</b>	Used in names of birds with partly pink plumage e g roseate tern. <i>The <b>roseate</b> glow of dawn.</i>
<b><u>scatter</u></b>	The act of scattering. <i>She waved her hand and <b>scattered</b> the crowds.</i>
<b><u>seep</u></b>	Pass gradually or leak through or as if through small openings. <i>Water began to <b>seep</b> through the soles of his boots.</i>
<b><u>spray</u></b>	An act of spraying something. <i>A fine <b>spray</b> of mud.</i>
<b>sprayer</b>	A worker who applies spray to a surface. <i>Light aircraft were employed as agricultural crop <b>sprayers</b>.</i>
<b>spread</b>	A tasty mixture to be spread on bread or crackers or used in preparing other dishes. <i>A patchwork <b>spread</b>.</i>
<b>suffuse</b>	Gradually spread through or over. <i>The first half of the poem is <b>suffused</b> with idealism.</i>
<b><u>tint</u></b>	Dye someone s hair with a tint. <i>A <b>tint</b> of glamour.</i>
