Associations of "Imbued" (30 Words)

achromatic	Relating to, using, or denoting lenses that transmit light without separating it into constituent colours. <i>The achromatic gloom.</i>
azure	Color azure. <i>White beaches surrounded by azure seas.</i>
color	Decorate with colors. <i>The situation soon took on a different color.</i>
complexion	A point of view or general attitude or inclination. <i>Diphthongs are complexions of vowels.</i>
diffuse	Spread or diffuse through. <i>The problem is how to diffuse power without creating anarchy.</i>
diffusion	The dissemination of elements of culture to another region or people. <i>The rate of diffusion of a gas.</i>
discolor	Cause to lose or change color. <i>The shirts discolored.</i>
disseminate	Spread throughout an organ or the body. <i>There is a subset of these low grade tumours that can disseminate and migrate.</i>
dissipate	Spend frivolously and unwisely. <i>He wanted to dissipate his anger.</i>
filter	A traffic light signalling a filter arrangement. <i>Filters can be used in photography to reduce haze.</i>
growing	Biology the process of an individual organism growing organically a purely biological unfolding of events involved in an organism changing gradually from a simple to a more complex level. <i>The growing concern over ozone levels.</i>
hue	A colour or shade. <i>Verdigris is greenish yellow in hue.</i>

leach	Cause a liquid to leach or percolate. <i>The nutrient is quickly leached away.</i>
<u>lightness</u>	The visual effect of illumination on objects or scenes as created in pictures. <i>The glass adds lightness to the room.</i>
percolate	Gain or regain energy. <i>He put some coffee on to percolate.</i>
perfuse	Force a fluid through (a body part or tissue). <i>The isolated perfused rat liver.</i>
<u>permeate</u>	Pass through. <i>Water permeates sand easily.</i>
<u>pervade</u>	Spread or diffuse through. <i>The sense of crisis which pervaded Europe in the 1930s.</i>
pigmentation	The deposition of pigment in animals or plants or human beings.
polychrome	Color with many colors make polychrome. <i>Painters gilded and polychromed the wooden carvings.</i>
<u>purple</u>	In ancient Rome or Byzantium clothing made from fabric dyed with Tyrian purple. <i>A writer of empurpled literature.</i>
roseate	Used in names of birds with partly pink plumage e g roseate tern. <i>The roseate glow of dawn.</i>
<u>scatter</u>	The act of scattering. <i>She waved her hand and scattered the crowds.</i>
<u>seep</u>	Pass gradually or leak through or as if through small openings. <i>Water began to seep through the soles of his boots.</i>
<u>spray</u>	An act of spraying something. <i>A fine spray of mud.</i>
sprayer	A worker who applies spray to a surface. <i>Light aircraft were employed as agricultural crop sprayers.</i>
spread	A tasty mixture to be spread on bread or crackers or used in preparing other dishes. <i>A patchwork spread.</i>
suffuse	Gradually spread through or over. <i>The first half of the poem is suffused with idealism.</i>
<u>tint</u>	Dye someone s hair with a tint. <i>A tint of glamour.</i>
