## **Immaterial as an Adjective**

### **Definitions of "Immaterial" as an adjective**

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “immaterial” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Not consisting of matter.*
- *Not pertinent to the matter under consideration.*
- *Unimportant under the circumstances; irrelevant.*
- *Without material form or substance.*
- *(often followed by `to') lacking importance; not mattering one way or the other.*
- *Lacking importance; not mattering one way or the other.*
- *Of no importance or relevance especially to a law case.*
- *Spiritual, rather than physical.*

### **Synonyms of "Immaterial" as an adjective (28 Words)**

<b>aerial</b>	Characterized by lightness and insubstantiality; as impalpable or intangible as air. <i>Small <b>aerial</b> creatures such as butterflies.</i>
<b><u>airy</u></b>	Having little or no perceptible weight; so light as to resemble air. <i><b>Airy</b> theories about socioeconomic improvement.</i>
<b>bodiless</b>	Lacking a body. <i><b>Bodiless</b> ghosts.</i>
<b>disembodied</b>	(of a sound) lacking any obvious physical source. <i>A <b>disembodied</b> ghost.</i>
<b><u>ethereal</u></b>	Extremely delicate and light in a way that seems not to be of this world. <i>This smallest and most <b>ethereal</b> of birds.</i>
<b>extraneous</b>	Not pertinent to the matter under consideration. <i>Relying upon an <b>extraneous</b> income.</i>
<b>impalpable</b>	Incapable of being perceived by the senses especially the sense of touch- James Jeans. <i>An <b>impalpable</b> cloud.</i>
<b><u>impertinent</u></b>	Improperly forward or bold. <i>Mentioned several <b>impertinent</b> facts before finally coming to the point.</i>
<b>inapposite</b>	Of an inappropriate or misapplied nature. <i>The Shakespearean allusions are <b>inapposite</b>.</i>
<b><u>inconsequential</u></b>	Not following logically as a consequence. <i>His work seems trivial and <b>inconsequential</b>.</i>
<b>incorporeal</b>	Not composed of matter; having no material existence. <i>A supreme but <b>incorporeal</b> being called God.</i>
<b>indifferent</b>	Characterized by a lack of partiality. <i>He gave an <b>indifferent</b> shrug.</i>
<b><u>insignificant</u></b>	Signifying nothing. <i><b>Insignificant</b> sounds.</i>
<b>insubstantial</b>	Lacking material form or substance; unreal. <i><b>Insubstantial</b> evidence.</i>
<b><u>intangible</u></b>	(of an asset or benefit) not constituting or represented by a physical object and of a value not precisely measurable. <i>The moonlight made things seem <b>intangible</b>.</i>
<b><u>irrelevant</u></b>	Having no bearing on or connection with the subject at issue. <i>An <b>irrelevant</b> comment.</i>

<b>neither here nor there</b>	Being here now.
<b>nonmaterial</b>	Not consisting of matter.
<b>not germane</b>	Relevant and appropriate.
<b>not material</b>	Derived from or composed of matter.
<b>not pertinent</b>	Being of striking appropriateness and pertinence.
<b>of little account</b>	Lowercase.
<b>of no matter</b>	Quantifier; used with either mass nouns or plural count nouns for indicating a complete or almost complete lack or zero quantity of.
<b>of no moment</b>	Quantifier; used with either mass nouns or plural count nouns for indicating a complete or almost complete lack or zero quantity of.
<b>orthogonal</b>	Having a set of mutually perpendicular axes; meeting at right angles. <i>Wind and sea may displace the ship's center of gravity along three <b>orthogonal</b> axes.</i>
<b>unembodied</b>	(of an idea, quality, or feeling) not having a tangible or visible form. <i>Claims to knowledge of an <b>unembodied</b> consciousness.</i>
<b>unimportant</b>	Devoid of importance, meaning, or force. <i>The question seems <b>unimportant</b>.</i>
<b>unsubstantial</b>	Having little or no solidity, reality, or factual basis. <i>A pretty if <b>unsubstantial</b> cubist composition.</i>

<b>ethereal</b>	Of or containing or dissolved in ether. <i><b>Ethereal</b> solution.</i>
<b>impalpable</b>	Imperceptible to the senses or the mind. <i>How would anyone come to a decision about something so <b>impalpable</b> as personhood.</i>
<b>inconsequential</b>	Not following logically as a consequence. <i>They talked about <b>inconsequential</b> things.</i>
<b>inconsiderable</b>	Unimportant or insignificant. <i>A not <b>inconsiderable</b> artist.</i>
<b>insignificant</b>	Signifying nothing. <i><b>Insignificant</b> sounds.</i>
<b>insubstantial</b>	Lacking strength and solidity. <i>An <b>insubstantial</b> and unsatisfying meal.</i>
<b>intangible</b>	An intangible thing. <i><b>Intangibles</b> like self confidence and responsibility.</i>
<b>irrelevant</b>	Not connected with or relevant to something. <i>An <b>irrelevant</b> comment.</i>
<b>meanness</b>	Aggressive character; viciousness. <i>The <b>meanness</b> of that existence.</i>
<b>minor</b>	Of a premise containing the minor term in a categorical syllogism. <i>Smith <b>minor</b>.</i>
<b>negligible</b>	Not worth considering. <i>The effect was <b>negligible</b>.</i>
<b>paltry</b>	(of an amount) very small or meagre. <i>A <b>paltry</b> wage.</i>
<b>pettiness</b>	Narrowness of mind or ideas or views. <i>These awesome moments lift us above the <b>pettiness</b> of the world.</i>
<b>picayune</b>	Small and of little importance. <i>The <b>picayune</b> squabbling of party politicians.</i>
<b>piddling</b>	(informal) small and of little importance. <i><b>Piddling</b> little questions.</i>

<b>slight</b>	Small in degree; inconsiderable. <i>There s a <b>slight</b> chance it will work.</i>
<b>small</b>	A garment size for a small person. <b>Small</b> a.
<b>subtle</b>	Working or spreading in a hidden and usually injurious way. <i>His whole attitude had undergone a <b>subtle</b> change.</i>
<b>supernal</b>	Of heaven or the spirit. <i>Interpret the plague as a visitation from heaven a <b>supernal</b> punishment for the sins of men.</i>
<b>tenuous</b>	Very slender or fine; insubstantial. <i>A <b>tenuous</b> argument.</i>
<b>tiny</b>	A very young child. <i>A <b>tiny</b> hummingbird.</i>
<b>trifling</b>	Not worth considering. <i>A <b>trifling</b> matter.</i>
<b>trivial</b>	Concerned with trivialities. <i>Huge fines were imposed for <b>trivial</b> offences.</i>
<b>undersized</b>	Smaller than normal for its kind. <i>The <b>undersized</b> cubs may not survive the winter.</i>
<b>undistinguished</b>	Not worthy of notice. <i>An <b>undistinguished</b> career.</i>
<b>unimportant</b>	Not important. <i>A relatively <b>unimportant</b> feature of the system.</i>
<b>vain</b>	Unproductive of success. <i>A <b>vain</b> attempt.</i>
