- *Having or showing an emotional or intellectual development appropriate to someone younger.*
- *Not fully developed.*
- *Not yet having developed feathers.*
- *Not fully developed or mature; not ripe.*
- *(of birds) not yet having developed feathers.*
- *(used of living things especially persons) in an early period of life or development or growth.*

<b>babyish</b>	Typical of or suitable for a baby; childish. <b>Babyish</b> tears and petulance.
<b><u>callow</u></b>	Young and inexperienced. Earnest and <b>callow</b> undergraduates.
<b>childish</b>	Indicating a lack of maturity. <b>Childish</b> enthusiasm.
<b>green</b>	Denoting a green light or flag used as a signal to proceed. The leaves are bright <b>green</b> .
<b>inexperienced</b>	Having little knowledge or experience of a particular thing. An <b>inexperienced</b> driver.

<b>infantile</b>	Of or occurring among babies or very young children. <i><b>Infantile</b> jokes.</i>
<b>ingenuous</b>	Lacking in sophistication or worldliness. <i>She s staggeringly <b>ingenuous</b> or possibly very cunning indeed.</i>
<b>jejune</b>	Of insufficient quantity to meet a need. <i>The <b>jejune</b> diets of the very poor.</i>
<u><b>juvenile</b></u>	Childish; immature. <i>Their behavior was <b>juvenile</b>.</i>
<u><b>naive</b></u>	Of or created by one without formal training simple or naive in style. <i>He took part in the experiment as a <b>naive</b> subject.</i>
<b>not mature</b>	Having developed feathers or plumage; often used in combination.
<b>not matured</b>	Fully considered and perfected.
<b>not ripe</b>	Fully developed or matured and ready to be eaten or used.
<b>puerile</b>	Displaying or suggesting a lack of maturity. <i>A <b>puerile</b> argument.</i>
<b>unfledged</b>	Not equipped with feathers. <i>She was <b>unfledged</b> and her mother saw physically unawakened.</i>
<b>unmellowed</b>	Not made mellow.
<b>unripe</b>	Not ripe. <i><b>Unripe</b> fruit.</i>
<b>unripened</b>	Not fully developed or mature; not ripe. <i>Pale <b>unripened</b> tomatoes.</i>
<u><b>unsophisticated</b></u>	Lacking complexity. <i>Either too <b>unsophisticated</b> or too honest to promise more than he could deliver.</i>
<b>unworldly</b>	Not seeming to belong to this planet; strange. <i>A pedantic <b>unworldly</b> boffin.</i>
<b>young</b>	Used to denote the younger of two people of the same name. <i>The <b>young</b> are amazingly resilient.</i>

<b>adolescence</b>	The time period between the beginning of puberty and adulthood. <i>During <b>adolescence</b> teenagers often experience violent mood swings.</i>
<u><a href="#">adolescent</a></u>	An adolescent boy or girl. <i><b>Adolescent</b> boys and girls.</i>
<b>age</b>	A particular stage in someone's life. <i>Children of primary school <b>age</b>.</i>
<b>boyish</b>	Of, like, or characteristic of a male child or young man. <i>School<b>boyish</b> pranks.</i>
<u><a href="#">callow</a></u>	(of a young person) inexperienced and immature. <i>Earnest and <b>callow</b> undergraduates.</i>
<u><a href="#">childhood</a></u>	The time of person's life when they are a child. <i>He spent his <b>childhood</b> in Lewes.</i>

<b>childish</b>	Of, like, or appropriate to a child. <b>Childish</b> tantrums.
<u><b>childlike</b></u>	Exhibiting childlike simplicity and credulity. <b>Childlike</b> charm.
<u><b>early</b></u>	During an early stage. An <b>early</b> goal secured victory.
<b>embryonic</b>	Relating to an embryo. The <b>embryonic</b> government staffed by survivors of the massacre.
<b>inexperienced</b>	Lacking practical experience or training. An <b>inexperienced</b> driver.
<b>infancy</b>	The early stage of growth or development. A son who died in <b>infancy</b> .
<b>infantile</b>	Indicating a lack of maturity. <b>Infantile</b> colic.
<b>jejune</b>	(of ideas or writings) dry and uninteresting. The <b>jejune</b> diets of the very poor.
<u><b>juvenile</b></u>	An actor playing a juvenile role. The light coloured plumage of a <b>juvenile</b> .
<b>lad</b>	A boy or man. She wouldn't let him go out with the <b>lads</b> any more.
<b>maturation</b>	The formation of pus in a boil, abscess, etc. White wines generally need less <b>maturation</b> than reds.
<b>playmate</b>	A friend with whom a child plays. Her clients use this album of photos to pick their ideal <b>playmate</b> .
<u><b>precocious</b></u>	Appearing or developing early. <b>Precocious</b> flowers appear before the leaves as in some species of magnolias.
<u><b>premature</b></u>	Born after a gestation period of less than the normal time. The sun can cause <b>premature</b> ageing.
<b>previous</b>	Previous convictions a criminal record. The <b>previous</b> owner.
<b>puberty</b>	The time of life when sex glands become functional. A particularly traumatic <b>puberty</b> .
<b>puerile</b>	Displaying or suggesting a lack of maturity. A <b>puerile</b> argument.
<b>teen</b>	A teenager. A <b>teen</b> idol.



<b>teenage</b>	Relating to or characteristic of teenagers. <i><b>Teenage</b> mothers.</i>
<b>teenager</b>	A person aged between 13 and 19 years.
<b>unpracticed</b>	Not having had extensive practice.
<b>vernal</b>	Suggestive of youth; vigorous and fresh. <i>The <b>vernal</b> freshness of the land.</i>
<b>young</b>	Young people collectively. <i>Hugh Magnus Macleod <b>younger</b> of Macleod.</i>
<b>youth</b>	An early stage in the development of something. <i>He had been a keen sportsman in his <b>youth</b>.</i>
