<b>measureless</b>	Having no bounds or limits; unlimited. <i>Otto had <b>measureless</b> charm.</i>
<b><u>unfathomable</u></b>	Incapable of being fully understood. <i>Mountains of <b>unfathomable</b> scale.</i>
<b>unmeasurable</b>	Not able to be measured objectively. <i><b>Unmeasurable</b> reaches of outer space.</i>
<b>untold</b>	(of a story or event) not narrated or recounted. <i>No event however boring is left <b>untold</b>.</i>

<b>incalculable</b>	Too much to be measured. <i>An archive of <b>incalculable</b> value.</i>
<b>indefinitely</b>	To an unlimited or unspecified degree or extent. <i>Talks cannot go on <b>indefinitely</b>.</i>
<b>inestimable</b>	Beyond calculation or measure. <i>Jewels of <b>inestimable</b> value.</i>
<b>inexhaustible</b>	(of an amount or supply of something) unable to be used up because existing in abundance. <i>His <b>inexhaustible</b> energy.</i>
<b><u>infinite</u></b>	A space or quantity that is infinite. <i>The boundless regions of the <b>infinite</b>.</i>
<b><u>infinity</u></b>	Time without end. <i>The <b>infinity</b> of space.</i>
<b><u>innumerable</u></b>	Too numerous to be counted. <i><b>Innumerable</b> difficulties.</i>
<b>interminable</b>	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>An <b>interminable</b> sermon.</i>
<b><u>limitless</u></b>	Having no limits in range or scope. <i>A <b>limitless</b> supply of money.</i>
<b>measureless</b>	Having no bounds or limits; unlimited. <i>Otto had <b>measureless</b> charm.</i>
<b>mortician</b>	One whose business is the management of funerals.
<b><u>myriad</u></b>	The cardinal number that is the product of ten and one thousand. <i><b>Myriad</b> stars.</i>
<b>numberless</b>	Too numerous to be counted. <i>There are <b>numberless</b> questions to be asked.</i>
<b>numerous</b>	Amounting to a large indefinite number. <i>The orchestra and chorus were <b>numerous</b>.</i>
<b>omnipotent</b>	Having unlimited power. <i>God is described as <b>omnipotent</b> and benevolent.</i>
<b>permanently</b>	In a way that lasts or remains unchanged indefinitely; for all time. <i>His lungs are <b>permanently</b> damaged.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Their <b>perpetual</b> money worries.</i>

- renewable** (of a natural resource or source of energy) not depleted when used.  
*A shift away from fossil fuels to **renewable** energy.*
- unbounded** Having or appearing to have no limits.  
***Unbounded** enthusiasm.*
- undying** (especially of an emotion) lasting forever.  
*Promises of **undying** love.*
- unlimited** Not limited or restricted in terms of number, quantity, or extent.  
*To start with a theory of **unlimited** freedom is to end up with **unlimited** despotism.*
