immensurable	Impossible to measure.
incalculable	(of a person or their character) unpredictable. <i>The odds against such an event are incalculable.</i>
incomputable	Unable to be calculated or estimated. <i>An incomputable amount.</i>
indeterminable	Not able to be definitely ascertained, calculated, or identified. <i>A woman of indeterminable age.</i>

inestimable	Beyond calculation or measure. <i>A treasure of inestimable value.</i>
<u>innumerable</u>	Too numerous to be counted. <i>Innumerable flags of all colours.</i>
measureless	Having no bounds or limits; unlimited. <i>Otto had measureless charm.</i>
<u>unfathomable</u>	Incapable of being fully understood. <i>Mountains of unfathomable scale.</i>
unmeasurable	Not able to be measured objectively. <i>Unmeasurable reaches of outer space.</i>
untold	(of a story or event) not narrated or recounted. <i>No event however boring is left untold.</i>

inexhaustible	(of an amount or supply of something) unable to be used up because existing in abundance. <i>His inexhaustible energy.</i>
<u>infinite</u>	A space or quantity that is infinite. <i>The boundless regions of the infinite.</i>
<u>infinity</u>	Time without end. <i>The infinity of space.</i>
<u>innumerable</u>	Too numerous to be counted. <i>Innumerable difficulties.</i>
interminable	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>An interminable sermon.</i>
<u>limitless</u>	Having no limits in range or scope. <i>A limitless supply of money.</i>
measureless	Having no bounds or limits; unlimited. <i>Otto had measureless charm.</i>
mortician	One whose business is the management of funerals.
<u>myriad</u>	The cardinal number that is the product of ten and one thousand. <i>Myriad stars.</i>
numberless	Too numerous to be counted. <i>There are numberless questions to be asked.</i>
numerous	Amounting to a large indefinite number. <i>The orchestra and chorus were numerous.</i>
omnipotent	Having unlimited power. <i>God is described as omnipotent and benevolent.</i>
permanently	In a way that lasts or remains unchanged indefinitely; for all time. <i>His lungs are permanently damaged.</i>
perpetual	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Their perpetual money worries.</i>

- renewable** (of a natural resource or source of energy) not depleted when used.
*A shift away from fossil fuels to **renewable** energy.*
- unbounded** Having or appearing to have no limits.
***Unbounded** enthusiasm.*
- undying** (especially of an emotion) lasting forever.
*Promises of **undying** love.*
- unlimited** Not limited or restricted in terms of number, quantity, or extent.
*To start with a theory of **unlimited** freedom is to end up with **unlimited** despotism.*
