- *The action of coming to live permanently in a foreign country.*

in-migration Migration into a place (especially migration to a country of which you are not a native in order to settle there.

<u>globalization</u>	Growth to a global or worldwide scale. <i>Fears about the increasing globalization of the world economy.</i>
globalize	Develop or be developed so as to make international influence or operation possible. <i>Building facilities overseas is part of the strategy of every company that aims to globalize.</i>
globe	Form something into a globe. <i>A brandy globe.</i>
globular	Globe-shaped; spherical. <i>Plants with distinctive globular blooms.</i>
intercontinental	Extending or taking place between or among continents. <i>An intercontinental flight.</i>
<u>international</u>	Any of several international socialist organizations. <i>A violation of international law.</i>
internationally	In, between, or among many different nations. <i>Companies looking to trade internationally.</i>
localization	The fact of being or becoming located or fixed in a particular place. <i>Differences in localization of growth control molecules in carcinoma.</i>
macrocosm	Everything that exists anywhere.
migration	A group of people migrating together (especially in some given time period). <i>This butterfly s annual migration across North America.</i>
multinational	Including or involving several countries or individuals of several nationalities. <i>The oil industry was entirely controlled by five multinationals.</i>
nationally	Extending throughout an entire nation. <i>Nationally advertised.</i>
nonnative	Of persons born in another area or country than that lived in. <i>Our large nonnative population.</i>

overseas	In a foreign country. <i>He spent quite a lot of time working overseas.</i>
populous	Having a large population; densely populated. <i>The populous city of Shanghai.</i>
southward	In a southerly direction. <i>People began a southward drift.</i>
transnational	Involving or operating in several nations or nationalities. <i>Transnational terrorist networks.</i>
<u>traveler</u>	A person who changes location.
westward	A direction or region towards the west. <i>They traveled westward toward the setting sun.</i>
world	Everything that exists anywhere. <i>He has almost completely withdrawn from the world.</i>
<u>worldwide</u>	Of worldwide scope or applicability. <i>Worldwide distribution.</i>
