<b>abiding</b>	Unceasing. <i>An <b>abiding</b> belief.</i>
<b>ageless</b>	Never looking old or appearing to grow old. <i>We often praise celebrities for their <b>ageless</b> appearance.</i>
<b>classic</b>	Considered of the highest quality and lasting significance or worth. <i>A <b>classic</b> car.</i>
<b>constant</b>	Unvarying in nature. <i>A <b>constant</b> lover.</i>
<b>deathless</b>	Never dying. <i>Pages of <b>deathless</b> prose.</i>

<b>everlasting</b>	Lasting forever or a very long time. <i>The damned would suffer <b>everlasting</b> torment.</i>
<b><u>lasting</u></b>	Lasting a long time without change. <i>A <b>lasting</b> happy marriage.</i>
<b><u>memorable</u></b>	Worth remembering or easily remembered, especially because of being special or unusual. <i>He recalled <b>memorable</b> moments in his life.</i>
<b>never dying</b>	In or associated with the process of passing from life or ceasing to be.
<b>never-ending</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.
<b><u>perennial</u></b>	(of a stream or spring) flowing throughout the year. <i>He is a <b>perennial</b> student.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	(of a plant) blooming or fruiting several times in one season. <i>He grows <b>perpetual</b> flowering carnations.</i>
<b>time-honoured</b>	Honored because of age or long usage.
<b><u>timeless</u></b>	Not affected by the passage of time or changes in fashion. <i>Antiques add to the <b>timeless</b> atmosphere of the dining room.</i>
<b>traditional</b>	Produced, done, or used in accordance with tradition. <i><b>Traditional</b> Elgarians.</i>
<b><u>undying</u></b>	(especially of an emotion) lasting forever. <i>Promises of <b>undying</b> love.</i>
<b><u>unforgettable</u></b>	Impossible to forget; very memorable. <i>That <b>unforgettable</b> first kiss.</i>

- changeless** Remaining the same for indefinitely long times.  
***Changeless** truths.*
- continually** Repeated frequently in the same way; regularly.  
*This information is **continually** updated.*
- continuously** Without interruption or gaps.  
*These images loop **continuously**.*
- endless** Having no known beginning and presumably no end.  
*An **endless** conversation.*
- eternal** Tiresomely long; seemingly without end.  
*She is an **eternal** optimist.*



<b>eternity</b>	Infinite or unending time. <i>The encounter between time and <b>eternity</b>.</i>
<b>ever</b>	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>Did you <b>ever</b> smoke.</i>
<b>everlasting</b>	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>Life <b>everlasting</b>.</i>
<b>forever</b>	Used in slogans of support after the name of something or someone. <i>She took <b>forever</b> to write the paper.</i>
<b>grinding</b>	Material resulting from the process of grinding. <i>Crush it and add it to the honey with a <b>grinding</b> of pepper and salt.</i>
<b>immortality</b>	The ability to live forever; eternal life. <i>Eating the fruit gave the gods <b>immortality</b>.</i>
<b>immortalize</b>	Make famous forever. <i>This melody <b>immortalized</b> its composer.</i>
<b>incessant</b>	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Night and day we live with the <b>incessant</b> noise of the city.</i>
<b>incessantly</b>	Without interruption. <i>She talked about him <b>incessantly</b>.</i>
<b>indefinite</b>	Vague or not clearly defined or stated. <i>An <b>indefinite</b> number of generations.</i>
<b>infinite</b>	A space or quantity that is infinite. <i>An <b>infinite</b> number of reasons.</i>
<b>infinity</b>	Time without end. <i>An <b>infinity</b> of combinations.</i>
<b>interminable</b>	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>We got bogged down in <b>interminable</b> discussions.</i>
<b>morbidity</b>	The condition of suffering from a disease or medical condition. <i>The levels of air pollution are associated with increased <b>morbidity</b> from respiratory diseases.</i>
<b>permanent</b>	Lasting or continuing without interruption. <i>Literature of <b>permanent</b> value.</i>
<b>perpetual</b>	(of an investment) having no fixed maturity date; irredeemable. <i>Deep caves in <b>perpetual</b> darkness.</i>
<b>perpetually</b>	Without interruption. <i><b>Perpetually</b> hungry teenage boys.</i>
<b>perpetuity</b>	The property of being perpetual (seemingly ceaseless). <i>He did not believe in the <b>perpetuity</b> of military rule.</i>

*Helen s **timeless** beauty.*
- unceasing** Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.  
*Man s **unceasing** warfare with drought and isolation.*
- unceasingly** With unflagging resolve.
- unchecked** Not examined or checked.  
*The broadcast was sloppy it was **unchecked** there was no investigation of the facts.*
- undying** (especially of an emotion) lasting forever.  
*Promises of **undying** love.*
- unlimited** Having no limits in range or scope- Philip Rahv.  
*Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not **unlimited**.*
