great	An important or distinguished person. <i>The lives of the great including Churchill and Newton.</i>

abiding	Unceasing. <i>An abiding belief.</i>
ageless	Never looking old or appearing to grow old. <i>We often praise celebrities for their ageless appearance.</i>
classic	Considered of the highest quality and lasting significance or worth. <i>A classic car.</i>
constant	Unvarying in nature. <i>A constant lover.</i>
deathless	Never dying. <i>Pages of deathless prose.</i>
endless	Having no known beginning and presumably no end. <i>An endless chain.</i>
enduring	Lasting over a period of time; durable. <i>He formed a number of enduring relationships with women.</i>

<u>eternal</u>	Lasting or existing forever; without end. <i>The secret of eternal youth.</i>
evergreen	Bearing foliage throughout the year. <i>This symphony is an evergreen favourite.</i>
everlasting	Lasting forever or a very long time. <i>The damned would suffer everlasting torment.</i>
<u>lasting</u>	Lasting a long time without change. <i>A lasting happy marriage.</i>
<u>memorable</u>	Worth remembering or easily remembered, especially because of being special or unusual. <i>He recalled memorable moments in his life.</i>
never dying	In or associated with the process of passing from life or ceasing to be.
never-ending	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.
<u>perennial</u>	(of a stream or spring) flowing throughout the year. <i>He is a perennial student.</i>
perpetual	(of a plant) blooming or fruiting several times in one season. <i>He grows perpetual flowering carnations.</i>
time-honoured	Honored because of age or long usage.
<u>timeless</u>	Not affected by the passage of time or changes in fashion. <i>Antiques add to the timeless atmosphere of the dining room.</i>
traditional	Produced, done, or used in accordance with tradition. <i>Traditional Elgarians.</i>
<u>undying</u>	(especially of an emotion) lasting forever. <i>Promises of undying love.</i>
<u>unforgettable</u>	Impossible to forget; very memorable. <i>That unforgettable first kiss.</i>

- continually** Repeated frequently in the same way; regularly.
*This information is **continually** updated.*
- continuously** Without interruption or gaps.
*These images loop **continuously**.*
- endless** Having no known beginning and presumably no end.
*An **endless** conversation.*
- eternal** Tiresomely long; seemingly without end.
*She is an **eternal** optimist.*

eternity	Infinite or unending time. <i>The encounter between time and eternity.</i>
ever	At all times all the time and on every occasion. <i>Did you ever smoke.</i>
everlasting	Without qualification; used informally as (often pejorative) intensifiers. <i>Life everlasting.</i>
forever	Used in slogans of support after the name of something or someone. <i>She took forever to write the paper.</i>
grinding	Material resulting from the process of grinding. <i>Crush it and add it to the honey with a grinding of pepper and salt.</i>
immortality	The ability to live forever; eternal life. <i>Eating the fruit gave the gods immortality.</i>
immortalize	Make famous forever. <i>This melody immortalized its composer.</i>
incessant	Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing. <i>Night and day we live with the incessant noise of the city.</i>
incessantly	Without interruption. <i>She talked about him incessantly.</i>
indefinite	Vague or not clearly defined or stated. <i>An indefinite number of generations.</i>
infinite	A space or quantity that is infinite. <i>An infinite number of reasons.</i>
infinity	Time without end. <i>An infinity of combinations.</i>
interminable	Tiresomely long; seemingly without end. <i>We got bogged down in interminable discussions.</i>
morbidity	The condition of suffering from a disease or medical condition. <i>The levels of air pollution are associated with increased morbidity from respiratory diseases.</i>
permanent	Lasting or continuing without interruption. <i>Literature of permanent value.</i>
perpetual	(of an investment) having no fixed maturity date; irredeemable. <i>Deep caves in perpetual darkness.</i>
perpetually	Without interruption. <i>Perpetually hungry teenage boys.</i>
perpetuity	The property of being perpetual (seemingly ceaseless). <i>He did not believe in the perpetuity of military rule.</i>

- unceasing** Uninterrupted in time and indefinitely long continuing.
*Man s **unceasing** warfare with drought and isolation.*
- unceasingly** With unflagging resolve.
- unchecked** Not examined or checked.
*The broadcast was sloppy it was **unchecked** there was no investigation of the facts.*
- undying** (especially of an emotion) lasting forever.
*Promises of **undying** love.*
- unlimited** Having no limits in range or scope- Philip Rahv.
*Offshore reserves of gas and oil are not **unlimited**.*
