Immune as an Adjective

Definitions of "Immune" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “immune” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Secure against.*
- *Relating to immune resistance.*
- *Protected or exempt, especially from an obligation or the effects of something.*
- *Not affected or influenced by something.*
- *Relating to or conferring immunity (to disease or infection).*
- *Relating to the condition of immunity.*
- *Resistant to a particular infection or toxin owing to the presence of specific antibodies or sensitized white blood cells.*
- *(usually followed by `to') not affected by a given influence.*
- *Not affected by a given influence.*



Synonyms of "Immune" as an adjective (10 Words)

- not exposed** With no protection or shield.
- not liable** Held legally responsible.
- not open** Ready or willing to receive favorably.
- not subject** Being under the power or sovereignty of another or others.
- not vulnerable** Susceptible to criticism or persuasion or temptation.
- resistant** Denoting starch that is not easily broken down by enzymes within the body and is therefore minimally absorbed during digestion.
*Plastic highly **resistant** to steam and water.*
- unaltered** Remaining the same; unchanged.
*Many buildings survive **unaltered**.*
- unchanged** Not made or become different.
*An **unchanged** side for tonight s home game.*

- uninfluenced** Not influenced or affected- V.L.Parrington.
*Styles of dress relatively **uninfluenced** by popular fashion.*
- unsusceptible** Not likely or liable to be influenced or harmed by a particular thing.
*Their meaning is **unsusceptible** of analysis.*



Usage Examples of "Immune" as an adjective

- *Immune from taxation as long as he resided in Bermuda.*
- *Immune from criminal prosecution.*
- *They were naturally immune to hepatitis B.*
- *No one is immune to his immense charm.*
- *They are immune from legal action.*
- *Immune to persuasion.*



Associations of "Immune" (30 Words)

- antibody** A blood protein produced in response to and counteracting a specific antigen. Antibodies combine chemically with substances which the body recognizes as alien, such as bacteria, viruses, and foreign substances in the blood.
- antigen** Any substance (as a toxin or enzyme) that stimulates an immune response in the body (especially the production of antibodies).
- defiant** Showing defiance.
*Brought up to be aggressive and **defiant**.*
- disease** A particular quality or disposition regarded as adversely affecting a person or group of people.
*Bacterial meningitis is quite a rare **disease**.*
- exempt** A person who is exempt from something especially the payment of tax.
*A beauty somehow **exempt** from the aging process.*

| fireproof | Make something fireproof. <i>Nearby museum buildings will be fireproofed.</i> |
| immunization | The action of making a person or animal immune to infection, typically by inoculation. <i>We recommend influenza immunization for all employees.</i> |
| immunize | Make (a person or animal) immune to infection, typically by inoculation. <i>The vaccine is used to immunize children against measles.</i> |
| impervious | Not allowing fluid to pass through. <i>A material impervious to water.</i> |
| incombustible | Not capable of igniting and burning. <i>An incombustible floor construction.</i> |
| influenza | An acute febrile highly contagious viral disease. |
| inoculation | The action of immunizing someone against a disease by introducing infective material, microorganisms, or vaccine into the body. <i>Inoculation against flu was readily available.</i> |
| insubordinate | Not submissive to authority. <i>An insubordinate attitude.</i> |
| nonflammable | Impossible to ignite. |
| ohm | The SI unit of electrical resistance, transmitting a current of one ampere when subjected to a potential difference of one volt. |
| penicillin | A blue mould of a type that produces penicillin. <i>Penicillins and cephalosporins.</i> |
| polio | An acute viral disease marked by inflammation of nerve cells of the brain stem and spinal cord. |
| rebellious | Showing a desire to resist authority, control, or convention. <i>He smoothed back a rebellious lock of hair.</i> |
| resistant | Denoting starch that is not easily broken down by enzymes within the body and is therefore minimally absorbed during digestion. <i>The new hybrid is more resistant to drought.</i> |
| resistive | Able to withstand the action or effect of something. |
| serum | The blood serum of an animal used to provide immunity to a pathogen or toxin by inoculation or as a diagnostic agent. <i>Doctors treated the bites of carpet vipers with serum produced from local snakes.</i> |
| smallpox | A highly contagious viral disease characterized by fever and weakness and skin eruption with pustules that form scabs that slough off leaving scars. |

| tetanus | An acute and serious infection of the central nervous system caused by bacterial infection of open wounds; spasms of the jaw and laryngeal muscles may occur during the late stages. |
| toughen | Make or become stronger or more resilient. <i>This experience will toughen her.</i> |
| <u>unaffected</u> | Unaware of or indifferent to. <i>Fibers remained apparently unaffected by the treatment.</i> |
| unruly | Noisy and lacking in restraint or discipline. <i>Unruly teenagers.</i> |
| vaccinate | Perform vaccinations or produce immunity in by inoculation. <i>The law required employers to vaccinate healthcare workers.</i> |
| vaccination | Taking a vaccine as a precaution against contracting a disease. <i>If you think you need a flu vaccination check with your doctor.</i> |
| vaccine | A program designed to detect computer viruses and inactivate them. <i>There is no vaccine against the virus.</i> |
| virus | An infection or disease caused by a virus. <i>The virus of cruelty that is latent in all human beings.</i> |
