- Resistant to a particular infection or toxin owing to the presence of specific antibodies or sensitized white blood cells.
- (usually followed by `to') not affected by a given influence.
- Not affected by a given influence.

A blood protein produced in response to and counteracting a specific antigen. Antibodies combine chemically with substances which the body recognizes as alien, such as bacteria, viruses, and foreign substances in

the blood.

**antigen**Any substance (as a toxin or enzyme) that stimulates an immune response in the body (conscielly the production of antibodies

in the body (especially the production of antibodies.

**defiant**Showing defiance.

Brought up to be aggressive and **defiant**.

A particular quality or disposition regarded as adversely affecting a person

**disease** or group of people.

Bacterial meningitis is quite a rare **disease**.

**exempt**A person who is exempt from something especially the payment of tax.

A beauty somehow **exempt** from the aging process.



**fireproof** Make something fireproof.

The action of making a person or animal immune to infection, typically by

immunization inoculation.

We recommend influenza **immunization** for all employees.

immunize Make (a person or animal) immune to infection, typically by inoculation.

The vaccine is used to **immunize** children against measles.

impervious Not allowing fluid to pass through.

A material **impervious** to water.

incombustible Not capable of igniting and burning.

An **incombustible** floor construction.

**influenza** An acute febrile highly contagious viral disease.

stem and spinal cord.
