## Immune as an Adjective

### Definitions of "Immune" as an adjective

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “immune” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

- *Secure against.*
- *Relating to immune resistance.*
- *Protected or exempt, especially from an obligation or the effects of something.*
- *Not affected or influenced by something.*
- *Relating to or conferring immunity (to disease or infection).*
- *Relating to the condition of immunity.*
- *Resistant to a particular infection or toxin owing to the presence of specific antibodies or sensitized white blood cells.*
- *(usually followed by `to') not affected by a given influence.*
- *Not affected by a given influence.*

- not exposed** With no protection or shield.
- not liable** Held legally responsible.
- not open** Ready or willing to receive favorably.
- not subject** Being under the power or sovereignty of another or others.
- not vulnerable** Susceptible to criticism or persuasion or temptation.
- resistant** Denoting starch that is not easily broken down by enzymes within the body and is therefore minimally absorbed during digestion.  
*Plastic highly **resistant** to steam and water.*
- unaltered** Remaining the same; unchanged.  
*Many buildings survive **unaltered**.*
- unchanged** Not made or become different.  
*An **unchanged** side for tonight s home game.*

- uninfluenced** Not influenced or affected- V.L.Parrington.  
*Styles of dress relatively **uninfluenced** by popular fashion.*
- unsusceptible** Not likely or liable to be influenced or harmed by a particular thing.  
*Their meaning is **unsusceptible** of analysis.*

## Associations of "Immune" (30 Words)

<b><u>antibody</u></b>	A blood protein produced in response to and counteracting a specific antigen. Antibodies combine chemically with substances which the body recognizes as alien, such as bacteria, viruses, and foreign substances in the blood.
<b>antigen</b>	Any substance (as a toxin or enzyme) that stimulates an immune response in the body (especially the production of antibodies).
<b>defiant</b>	Showing defiance. <i>Brought up to be aggressive and <b>defiant</b>.</i>
<b>disease</b>	A particular quality or disposition regarded as adversely affecting a person or group of people. <i>Bacterial meningitis is quite a rare <b>disease</b>.</i>
<b>exempt</b>	A person who is exempt from something especially the payment of tax. <i>A beauty somehow <b>exempt</b> from the aging process.</i>

<b>fireproof</b>	Make something fireproof. <i>Nearby museum buildings will be <b>fireproofed</b>.</i>
<b>immunization</b>	The action of making a person or animal immune to infection, typically by inoculation. <i>We recommend influenza <b>immunization</b> for all employees.</i>
<b>immunize</b>	Make (a person or animal) immune to infection, typically by inoculation. <i>The vaccine is used to <b>immunize</b> children against measles.</i>
<b>impervious</b>	Not allowing fluid to pass through. <i>A material <b>impervious</b> to water.</i>
<b>incombustible</b>	Not capable of igniting and burning. <i>An <b>incombustible</b> floor construction.</i>
<b>influenza</b>	An acute febrile highly contagious viral disease.
<b>inoculation</b>	The action of immunizing someone against a disease by introducing infective material, microorganisms, or vaccine into the body. <i><b>Inoculation</b> against flu was readily available.</i>
<b>insubordinate</b>	Not submissive to authority. <i>An <b>insubordinate</b> attitude.</i>
<b>nonflammable</b>	Impossible to ignite.
<b>ohm</b>	The SI unit of electrical resistance, transmitting a current of one ampere when subjected to a potential difference of one volt.
<b>penicillin</b>	A blue mould of a type that produces penicillin. <i><b>Penicillins</b> and cephalosporins.</i>
<b>polio</b>	An acute viral disease marked by inflammation of nerve cells of the brain stem and spinal cord.
<b>rebellious</b>	Showing a desire to resist authority, control, or convention. <i>He smoothed back a <b>rebellious</b> lock of hair.</i>
<b>resistant</b>	Denoting starch that is not easily broken down by enzymes within the body and is therefore minimally absorbed during digestion. <i>The new hybrid is more <b>resistant</b> to drought.</i>
<b>resistive</b>	Able to withstand the action or effect of something.
<b>serum</b>	The blood serum of an animal used to provide immunity to a pathogen or toxin by inoculation or as a diagnostic agent. <i>Doctors treated the bites of carpet vipers with <b>serum</b> produced from local snakes.</i>
<b>smallpox</b>	A highly contagious viral disease characterized by fever and weakness and skin eruption with pustules that form scabs that slough off leaving scars.

<b>tetanus</b>	An acute and serious infection of the central nervous system caused by bacterial infection of open wounds; spasms of the jaw and laryngeal muscles may occur during the late stages.
<b>toughen</b>	Make or become stronger or more resilient. <i>This experience will <b>toughen</b> her.</i>
<b><u>unaffected</u></b>	Unaware of or indifferent to. <i>Fibers remained apparently <b>unaffected</b> by the treatment.</i>
<b>unruly</b>	Noisy and lacking in restraint or discipline. <i><b>Unruly</b> teenagers.</i>
<b>vaccinate</b>	Perform vaccinations or produce immunity in by inoculation. <i>The law required employers to <b>vaccinate</b> healthcare workers.</i>
<b>vaccination</b>	Taking a vaccine as a precaution against contracting a disease. <i>If you think you need a flu <b>vaccination</b> check with your doctor.</i>
<b>vaccine</b>	A program designed to detect computer viruses and inactivate them. <i>There is no <b>vaccine</b> against the virus.</i>
<b>virus</b>	An infection or disease caused by a virus. <i>The <b>virus</b> of cruelty that is latent in all human beings.</i>
