

sincere hypocritical.

Felt **sincere** regret that they were leaving.

torrid Extremely hot and dry.

Hot trumpets and **torrid** rhythms.

urgent Of an action or event done or arranged in response to an urgent situation.

Bridges in **urgent** need of repair.

vehement Showing strong feeling; forceful, passionate, or intense.

A **vehement** defense.

wholehearted With unconditional and enthusiastic devotion.

Gave **wholehearted** support to her candidacy.

Zealous Marked by active interest and enthusiasm.

The council was extremely **zealous** in the application of the regulations.
