Synonyms of "Impatience" as a noun (22 Words)

agitation	A state of agitation or turbulent change or development. Widespread agitation for social reform.
annoyance	The feeling or state of being annoyed; irritation. <i>He turned his charm on Tara much to Hegarty s annoyance.</i>
discontent	Dissatisfaction with one's circumstances; lack of contentment. The cause attracted a motley crew of discontent s and zealots.
disgruntlement	A feeling of sulky discontent. <i>The survey pointed to widespread</i> disgruntlement <i>over recent pay rises.</i>
<u>displeasure</u>	The feeling of being displeased or annoyed or dissatisfied with someone or something. <i>He started hanging around the local pubs much to the displeasure of his mother.</i>
<u>dissatisfaction</u>	The feeling of being displeased and discontent. Widespread public dissatisfaction with incumbent politicians.



Feelings of anxiety that make you tense and irritable.
Actions that cause great irritation (or even anger. <i>She rolled her eyes in exasperation.</i>
Excessive sensitivity of an organ or body part.
An event or circumstance that causes one to feel frustrated. <i>The frustration of their wishes.</i>
An inability to eat a food or take a drug without adverse effects. <i>His intolerance of interruptions.</i>
A feeling of resentful anger.
A disposition to exhibit uncontrolled anger. Symptoms include insomnia and irritability .
The anxious feeling you have when you have the jitters.
The anxious feeling you have when you have the jitters. There was a trace of nervousness in his voice.
An irritable petulant feeling.
A feeling of irritation or resentment resulting from a slight, especially to one's pride. <i>He left in a fit of pique</i> .
The quality of being given to complaining.
Characterized by nervousness and quickness to take fright.
The quality of being ceaselessly moving or active. <i>Her husband s nocturnal restlessness.</i>
Feeling easily irritated.

Associations of "Impatience" (30 Words)

agitated	Feeling or appearing troubled or nervous. The agitated mixture foamed and bubbled.
anxiety	(psychiatry) a relatively permanent state of worry and nervousness occurring in a variety of mental disorders, usually accompanied by compulsive behavior or attacks of panic. <i>The housekeeper s eager anxiety to please.</i>
apprehensive	Relating to perception or understanding. <i>Apprehensive</i> for one s life.
aroused	Aroused to action. The aroused opposition.
<u>awkwardness</u>	The inelegance of someone stiff and unrelaxed (as by embarrassment. <i>The awkwardness of youth.</i>



<u>dejection</u>	A state of melancholy depression. <i>He was slumped in deep dejection.</i>
excitability	Excessive sensitivity of an organ or body part.
febrile	Having or showing the symptoms of a fever. A febrile reaction caused by an allergen.
<u>feverish</u>	Marked by intense agitation or emotion. Worked at a feverish pace.
fraught	Marked by distress. Marketing any new product is fraught with danger.
insecurity	The state of being open to danger or threat; lack of protection. <i>Growing job insecurity</i> .
jittery	Being in a tense state. <i>Caffeine makes me jittery.</i>
manic	Affected with or marked by frenzy or mania uncontrolled by reason- H.W.Carter. <i>Manic patients</i> .
moodiness	Having temperamental and changeable moods.
<u>nervous</u>	Of or relating to the nervous system. <i>He s nervous of speaking in public.</i>
nervously	In an anxiously nervous manner. Kevin nervously glanced at his watch.
nervy	Easily agitated or alarmed; nervous. <i>He was nervy and on edge.</i>
neurosis	(in non-technical use) excessive and irrational anxiety or obsession. <i>Freud s two stage account of neurosis.</i>
peevish	Easily irritated or annoyed. A thin peevish voice.
phobic	Suffering from irrational fears. A snake phobic .
slump	Fall or sink heavily. She slump ed against the cushions.
solicitude	A feeling of excessive concern. I was touched by his solicitude .
<u>strained</u>	Of a mainly liquid substance having been strained to separate out any solid matter. A strained smile.



stressed	Strengthened by the application of stress during manufacture prestressed. <i>Stressed</i> workers reported smoking more.
<u>temper</u>	Make more temperate acceptable or suitable by adding something else moderate. <i>His temper sparked like damp firewood.</i>
<u>tense</u>	Cause to be tense and uneasy or nervous or anxious. <i>Tense</i> piano strings.
troubled	Characterized by unrest or disorder or insubordination. Fell into a troubled sleep.
<u>uneasy</u>	Lacking a sense of security or affording no ease or reassurance. She lived in a state of uneasy truce with her strict father.
<u>uptight</u>	Anxious or angry in a tense and overly controlled way. <i>He is so uptight about everything.</i>
worried	Afflicted with or marked by anxious uneasiness or trouble or grief. Not used to a city and worried about small things.
