excitability Excessive sensitivity of an organ or body part.

An event or circumstance that causes one to feel frustrated.

The **frustration** of their wishes.

An inability to eat a food or take a drug without adverse effects.

His **intolerance** of interruptions.

irascibility A feeling of resentful anger.

irritability

A disposition to exhibit uncontrolled anger.

Symptoms include insomnia and irritability.

jitteriness The anxious feeling you have when you have the jitters.

nervousness
There was a trace of nervousness in his voice.

peevishness An irritable petulant feeling.

A feeling of irritation or resentment resulting from a slight, especially to

pique one's pride.

He left in a fit of **pique**.

querulousness The quality of being given to complaining.

restiveness Characterized by nervousness and quickness to take fright.

The quality of being ceaselessly moving or active.

Her husband s nocturnal restlessness.

testiness Feeling easily irritated. **tetchiness** Feeling easily irritated.

stressed Strengthened by the application of stress during manufacture prestressed.

Stressed workers reported smoking more.

Make more temperate acceptable or suitable by adding something else

<u>temper</u> moderate.

His **temper** sparked like damp firewood.

tense Cause to be tense and uneasy or nervous or anxious.

Tense piano strings.

troubled Characterized by unrest or disorder or insubordination.

Fell into a **troubled** sleep.

Lacking a sense of security or affording no ease or reassurance.

She lived in a state of **uneasy** truce with her strict father.

uptightAnxious or angry in a tense and overly controlled way.

He is so **uptight** about everything.

worried Afflicted with or marked by anxious uneasiness or trouble or grief.
