balk	The area on a billiard table behind the balkline. A <b>balk</b> of timber.
<u>bar</u>	A barrier or restriction to an action or advance. <i>He bought a hot dog and a coke at the <b>bar</b>.</i>
barrier	Any condition that makes it difficult to make progress or to achieve an objective. <i>The mountain</i> <b>barrier</b> <i>between Norway and Sweden</i> .
baulk	Something immaterial that interferes with or delays action or progress.
block	A starting block. Jackson jetted out of his <b>block</b> s.
brake	An area thickly overgrown usually with one kind of plant. <i>He slammed on his <b>brake</b>s.</i>



check	A move by which a piece or pawn directly attacks the opponent s king and by which the king may be checkmated. They made a <b>check</b> of their equipment.
curb	An edge between a sidewalk and a roadway consisting of a line of curbstones usually forming part of a gutter. <i>Plans to introduce tougher curbs on insider dealing.</i>
deterrent	A thing that discourages or is intended to discourage someone from doing something. Cameras are a major <b>deterrent</b> to crime.
encumbrance	An impediment or burden. For parents childhood is too long a period of <b>encumbrance</b> .
handicap	A race or contest in which a handicap is imposed. Not being able to drive was something of a <b>handicap</b> .
hinderance	Any obstruction that impedes or is burdensome.
<u>hindrance</u>	A thing that provides resistance, delay, or obstruction to something or someone. <i>The visitor can wander around without hindrance</i> .
impedimenta	Equipment for an activity or expedition, especially when considered as bulky or an encumbrance. She collected her briefcase and other <b>impedimenta</b> .
limitation	The quality of being limited or restricted. It is a good plan but it has serious <b>limitation</b> s.
lisp	A speech defect in which s is pronounced like th in thick and z is pronounced like th in this. <i>He spoke with a slight lisp</i> .
obstacle	Something immaterial that stands in the way and must be circumvented or surmounted. The major <b>obstacle</b> to achieving that goal is money.
obstructer	Someone who systematically obstructs some action that others want to take.
obstruction	The physical condition of blocking or filling a passage with an obstruction. The filibuster was a major <b>obstruction</b> to the success of their plan.
obstructor	Any structure that makes progress difficult.
restraint	Unemotional, dispassionate, or moderate behaviour; self-control. <b>Restraint</b> s imposed on imports.
restriction	A principle that limits the extent of something. The <b>restriction</b> of the infection to a focal area.



speech defect	The mental faculty or power of vocal communication.	
speech impediment Communication by word of mouth.		
stammer	A tendency to stammer. As a young man he had a dreadful <b>stammer</b> .	
<u>stutter</u>	A tendency to stutter while speaking. <i>She s p perfectly j justified he said with his intermittent <b>stutter</b>.</i>

# Associations of "Impediment" (30 Words)

balk	The area on a billiard table between the balk line and the bottom cushion within which in some circumstances a ball is protected from a direct stroke. <i>He raised every objection he could to balk this plan.</i>
barrier	A circumstance or obstacle that keeps people or things apart or prevents communication or progress. Intolerance is a <b>barrier</b> to understanding.
deterrent	Able or intended to deter. The <b>deterrent</b> effects of high prices.
difficulty	A situation that is difficult or dangerous. Guy had no <b>difficulty</b> in making friends.
<u>disrupt</u>	<ul> <li>(of a company or form of technology) cause radical change in (an industry or market) by means of innovation.</li> <li>If an explosion of volcanic steam had formed the crater the blast from below would have <b>disrupt</b>ed the underlying rock.</li> </ul>
<u>distraction</u>	A thing that prevents someone from concentrating on something else. <i>He drives me to <b>distraction</b>.</i>
falter	Be unsure or weak. He <b>falter</b> ed and finally stopped in mid stride.
hesitate	Interrupt temporarily an activity before continuing. <i>He</i> <b>hesitate</b> d to spoil the mood by being inquisitive.
hinderance	Something immaterial that interferes with or delays action or progress.
<u>hindrance</u>	A thing that provides resistance, delay, or obstruction to something or someone. A <b>hindrance</b> to the development process.



<u>hurdle</u>	Jump over a hurdle or other obstacle while running. All 450 runners had <b>hurdle</b> d the barriers.
inconvenience	To cause inconvenience or discomfort to. The <b>inconvenience</b> of having to change trains.
incubus	A male demon believed to have sexual intercourse with sleeping women. Debt is a big <b>incubus</b> in developing countries.
insuperable	Incapable of being surmounted or excelled. <i>Insuperable</i> heroes.
interference	The action of interfering or the process of being interfered with. An unwarranted <b>interference</b> with personal liberty.
<u>intervene</u>	Be situated between things. Christmas <b>intervene</b> d and the investigation was suspended.
<u>intervention</u>	A proceeding that permits a person to enter into a lawsuit already in progress; admission of person not an original party to the suit so that person can protect some right or interest that is allegedly affected by the proceedings. <i>It occurs without human intervention</i> .
<u>mumble</u>	A soft indistinct utterance. The old man had no teeth left and <b>mumble</b> d his food.
<u>murmur</u>	Make complaining remarks or noises under one's breath. A quiet <b>murmur</b> of thanks.
nuisance	An act which is harmful or offensive to the public or a member of it and for which there is a legal remedy. <i>I hope you re not going to make a <b>nuisance</b> of yourself.</i>
obstacle	An obstruction that stands in the way (and must be removed or surmounted or circumvented. <i>The major <b>obstacle</b> to achieving that goal is money.</i>
obstruction	The physical condition of blocking or filling a passage with an obstruction. They were held for <b>obstruction</b> and other public order offences.
obtrude	Push to thrust outward. I felt unable to <b>obtrude</b> my private sorrow upon anyone.
<u>pitfall</u>	A trap in the form of a concealed hole. The <b>pitfall</b> s of buying goods at public auctions.
retardation	The action of delaying or slowing the progress or development of something. The goals of treatment include <b>retardation</b> of disease progression.
snag	Catch on a snag. Keep an emery board handy in case of nail <b>snag</b> s.



stammer	A tendency to stammer. I <b>stammer</b> ed out my history.
stumble	An unintentional but embarrassing blunder. <i>He broke a bone in his foot in a <b>stumble</b> down an Alpine pass.</i>
<u>stutter</u>	A tendency to stutter while speaking. A machine gun shattered the quiet with its explosive <b>stutter</b> .
