menacing Suggesting the presence of danger; threatening.

Our officers encountered **menacing** looks from teenagers.

Located on the nearside of a vehicle.

near The conflict is unlikely to be resolved in the near future.

nearing Being on the left side.

threatening Threatening or foreshadowing evil or tragic developments.

She was a type he found **threatening**.

upcoming Of the relatively near future. The **upcoming** spring fashions.

Associations of "Impending" (30 Words)

contiguous Very close or connected in space or time.

corollary proposition.

currently At the present time.

Currently they live in Connecticut.

disasterAn event or fact that has unfortunate consequences.

Disaster struck within minutes of take off.

Cause to have an unfortunate and inescapable outcome.

Fuel was spilling out of the damaged wing and the aircraft was **doom**ed.



A sudden unforeseen crisis (usually involving danger) that requires

exigency immediate action.

The health care **exigency**.

exigent Pressing; demanding.

Regarded literary questions as **exigent** and momentous.

extemporaneous Spoken or done without preparation.

An **extemporaneous** piano recital.

extempore With little or no preparation or forethought.

He recited the poem **extempore**.

extemporizeManage in a makeshift way; do with whatever is at hand.

He **extemporize**d at the piano.

forewarn Inform (someone) of a possible future danger or problem.

He had been **forewarn**ed of a coup plot.

immediate Immediately before or after as in a chain of cause and effect.

The **immediate** concern was how to avoid taxes.

immediately In direct or very close relation.

I rang **immediately** for an ambulance.

imminent Overhanging.

They were in **imminent** danger of being swept away.

Done without being planned, organized, or rehearsed.

An **impromptu** press conference.

improvise Perform without preparation.

I **improvise**d a costume for myself out of an old blue dress.

improvised Done or made using whatever is available; makeshift.

An **improvised** short speech.

instant Instant coffee.

now

The offence justified **instant** dismissal.

instantaneous Occurring or done instantly.

Her reaction was almost **instantaneous**.

instantly At once; immediately.

She fell asleep almost **instantly**.

In these times.

I didn t receive the letter but it hardly matters **now**.

After a short time; soon.

presentlyHe is **presently** our ambassador to the United Nations.

Expressing something strongly or persistently.

pressingAt the **pressing** of a button.



promptThe time limit for the payment of an account stated on a prompt note.
