calm	(of weather) free from storm or wind. Remained calm throughout the uproar.
collected	(of individual works) brought together in one volume or edition. The witness remained collected throughout the cross examination.



composed	Serenely self-possessed and free from agitation especially in times of stress. I felt calm and more composed than I had in a long time.
cool, calm, and collected	Inducing the impression of coolness; used especially of greens and blues and violets.
even-tempered	Not easily irritated.
phlegmatic	(of a person) having an unemotional and stolidly calm disposition. A phlegmatic and certainly undemonstrative man.
<u>placid</u>	Calm and peaceful, with little movement or activity. The placid waters of a small lake.
poised	Having a graceful and elegant bearing. George s poised hammer.
relaxed	Without strain or anxiety. We were having a great time and feeling very relaxed .
<u>sedate</u>	Dignified and somber in manner or character and committed to keeping promises. In the old days business was carried on at a rather more sedate pace.
self-possessed	In full control of your faculties.
<u>serene</u>	Not agitated; without losing self-possession. A serene expression on her face.
<u>tranquil</u>	Not agitated; without losing self-possession. She became more tranquil .
unexcitable	Not easily excited. An unexcitable temperament.
unflappable	Not easily perturbed or excited or upset; marked by extreme calm and composure. Self contained unflappable Glaswegian common sense.

<u>ambience</u>	A particular environment or surrounding influence. The relaxed ambience of the cocktail lounge is popular with guests.
calm	Cause to be calm or quiet as by administering a sedative to. <i>Calm seas.</i>
calming	The act of appeasing (as by acceding to the demands of.
<u>calmness</u>	Steadiness of mind under stress. This relative calmness ended at around 7 a m when the wind picked up speed.
composed	Serenely self-possessed and free from agitation especially in times of stress. <i>The performer seemed completely</i> composed <i>as she stepped onto the stage.</i>
composure	The state or feeling of being calm and in control of oneself. She was struggling to regain her composure .
coolheaded	Marked by calm self-control (especially in trying circumstances); unemotional. Stayed coolheaded in the crisis.
equanimity	Steadiness of mind under stress. She accepted both the good and the bad with equanimity .
halcyon	A large kingfisher widely distributed in warmer parts of the Old World. <i>The halcyon days of the clipper trade.</i>
<u>hush</u>	Tranquil silence. Management took steps to hush up the dangers.
<u>idyllic</u>	Suggestive of an idyll; charmingly simple and serene. An idyllic spot for a picnic.
noiseless	Making no sound- Shakespeare. Th inaudible and noiseless foot of time.
nonviolence	Peaceful resistance to a government by fasting or refusing to cooperate.
nonviolent	Abstaining (on principle) from the use of violence.
pacific	The largest ocean in the world. The pacific temper seeks to settle disputes on grounds of justice rather than by force.
peaceful	Peacefully resistant in response to injustice. She said her dad was a peaceful man who was always happy.
peacetime	A period of time during which there is no war. In peacetime regiments were billeted upon towns and villages.



<u>placid</u>	Not easily irritated. Not everyone shared his placid temperament.
quietude	A state of peace and quiet. It highlights her quietude and wise passivity.
<u>restful</u>	Having a quiet and soothing quality. She spent a restful night at home.
<u>sedate</u>	Cause to be calm or quiet as by administering a sedative to. <i>Sedate</i> suburban domesticity.
<u>serene</u>	Completely clear and fine. Not a cloud obscured the deep serene .
<u>serenity</u>	A disposition free from stress or emotion. An oasis of serenity amidst the bustling city.
<u>stillness</u>	The absence of movement or sound. An eerie stillness engulfed the camp.
<u>tranquil</u>	(of a body of water) free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i>Tranquil</i> life in the country.
tranquility	A state of peace and quiet.
tranquilize	Make calm or still.
tranquillity	A state of peace and quiet. Passing cars are the only noise that disturbs the tranquillity of rural life.
unarmed	(used of plants or animals) lacking barbs or stings or thorns. <i>He was shooting unarmed civilians.</i>
unflappable	Having or showing calmness in a crisis. I prided myself on being unflappable even in the most chaotic circumstances.
