Synonyms of "Imperturbable" as an adjective (15 Words)

calm

(of weather) free from storm or wind.
*Remained **calm** throughout the uproar.*

collected

(of individual works) brought together in one volume or edition.
*The witness remained **collected** throughout the cross examination.*

composed	Serenely self-possessed and free from agitation especially in times of stress. <i>I felt calm and more composed than I had in a long time.</i>
cool, calm, and collected	Inducing the impression of coolness; used especially of greens and blues and violets.
even-tempered	Not easily irritated.
phlegmatic	(of a person) having an unemotional and stolidly calm disposition. <i>A phlegmatic and certainly undemonstrative man.</i>
placid	Calm and peaceful, with little movement or activity. <i>The placid waters of a small lake.</i>
poised	Having a graceful and elegant bearing. <i>George s poised hammer.</i>
relaxed	Without strain or anxiety. <i>We were having a great time and feeling very relaxed.</i>
sedate	Dignified and somber in manner or character and committed to keeping promises. <i>In the old days business was carried on at a rather more sedate pace.</i>
self-possessed	In full control of your faculties.
serene	Not agitated; without losing self-possession. <i>A serene expression on her face.</i>
tranquil	Not agitated; without losing self-possession. <i>She became more tranquil.</i>
unexcitable	Not easily excited. <i>An unexcitable temperament.</i>
unflappable	Not easily perturbed or excited or upset; marked by extreme calm and composure. <i>Self contained unflappable Glaswegian common sense.</i>

Usage Examples of "Imperturbable" as an adjective

- *Hitherto imperturbable, he now showed signs of alarm.*
- *An imperturbable self-possession.*

Associations of "Imperturbable" (30 Words)

<u>ambience</u>	A particular environment or surrounding influence. <i>The relaxed ambience of the cocktail lounge is popular with guests.</i>
calm	Cause to be calm or quiet as by administering a sedative to. <i>Calm seas.</i>
calming	The act of appeasing (as by acceding to the demands of). Steadiness of mind under stress.
<u>calmness</u>	<i>This relative calmness ended at around 7 a m when the wind picked up speed.</i>
composed	Serenely self-possessed and free from agitation especially in times of stress. <i>The performer seemed completely composed as she stepped onto the stage.</i>
composure	The state or feeling of being calm and in control of oneself. <i>She was struggling to regain her composure.</i>
coolheaded	Marked by calm self-control (especially in trying circumstances); unemotional. <i>Stayed coolheaded in the crisis.</i>
equanimity	Steadiness of mind under stress. <i>She accepted both the good and the bad with equanimity.</i>
halcyon	A large kingfisher widely distributed in warmer parts of the Old World. <i>The halcyon days of the clipper trade.</i>
<u>hush</u>	Tranquil silence. <i>Management took steps to hush up the dangers.</i>
<u>idyllic</u>	Suggestive of an idyll; charmingly simple and serene. <i>An idyllic spot for a picnic.</i>
noiseless	Making no sound- Shakespeare. <i>Th inaudible and noiseless foot of time.</i>
nonviolence	Peaceful resistance to a government by fasting or refusing to cooperate.
nonviolent	Abstaining (on principle) from the use of violence.
pacific	The largest ocean in the world. <i>The pacific temper seeks to settle disputes on grounds of justice rather than by force.</i>
peaceful	Peacefully resistant in response to injustice. <i>She said her dad was a peaceful man who was always happy.</i>
peacetime	A period of time during which there is no war. <i>In peacetime regiments were billeted upon towns and villages.</i>

<u>placid</u>	Not easily irritated. <i>Not everyone shared his placid temperament.</i>
quietude	A state of peace and quiet. <i>It highlights her quietude and wise passivity.</i>
<u>restful</u>	Having a quiet and soothing quality. <i>She spent a restful night at home.</i>
<u>sedate</u>	Cause to be calm or quiet as by administering a sedative to. Sedate suburban domesticity.
<u>serene</u>	Completely clear and fine. <i>Not a cloud obscured the deep serene.</i>
<u>serenity</u>	A disposition free from stress or emotion. <i>An oasis of serenity amidst the bustling city.</i>
<u>stillness</u>	The absence of movement or sound. <i>An eerie stillness engulfed the camp.</i>
<u>tranquil</u>	(of a body of water) free from disturbance by heavy waves. Tranquil life in the country.
<u>tranquility</u>	A state of peace and quiet.
tranquilize	Make calm or still.
tranquillity	A state of peace and quiet. <i>Passing cars are the only noise that disturbs the tranquillity of rural life.</i>
unarmed	(used of plants or animals) lacking barbs or stings or thorns. <i>He was shooting unarmed civilians.</i>
unflappable	Having or showing calmness in a crisis. <i>I prided myself on being unflappable even in the most chaotic circumstances.</i>
