## Synonyms of "Imperturbable" as an adjective (15 Words)

**calm**

(of weather) free from storm or wind.  
*Remained **calm** throughout the uproar.*

**collected**

(of individual works) brought together in one volume or edition.  
*The witness remained **collected** throughout the cross examination.*

<b>composed</b>	Serenely self-possessed and free from agitation especially in times of stress. <i>I felt calm and more <b>composed</b> than I had in a long time.</i>
<b>cool, calm, and collected</b>	Inducing the impression of coolness; used especially of greens and blues and violets.
<b>even-tempered</b>	Not easily irritated.
<b>phlegmatic</b>	(of a person) having an unemotional and stolidly calm disposition. <i>A <b>phlegmatic</b> and certainly undemonstrative man.</i>
<b>placid</b>	Calm and peaceful, with little movement or activity. <i>The <b>placid</b> waters of a small lake.</i>
<b>poised</b>	Having a graceful and elegant bearing. <i>George s <b>poised</b> hammer.</i>
<b>relaxed</b>	Without strain or anxiety. <i>We were having a great time and feeling very <b>relaxed</b>.</i>
<b>sedate</b>	Dignified and somber in manner or character and committed to keeping promises. <i>In the old days business was carried on at a rather more <b>sedate</b> pace.</i>
<b>self-possessed</b>	In full control of your faculties.
<b>serene</b>	Not agitated; without losing self-possession. <i>A <b>serene</b> expression on her face.</i>
<b>tranquil</b>	Not agitated; without losing self-possession. <i>She became more <b>tranquil</b>.</i>
<b>unexcitable</b>	Not easily excited. <i>An <b>unexcitable</b> temperament.</i>
<b>unflappable</b>	Not easily perturbed or excited or upset; marked by extreme calm and composure. <i>Self contained <b>unflappable</b> Glaswegian common sense.</i>

## Usage Examples of "Imperturbable" as an adjective

- *An imperturbable tranquillity.*
- *Hitherto imperturbable, he now showed signs of alarm.*
- *An imperturbable self-possession.*

## Associations of "Imperturbable" (30 Words)

<b><u>ambience</u></b>	A particular environment or surrounding influence. <i>The relaxed <b>ambience</b> of the cocktail lounge is popular with guests.</i>
<b>calm</b>	Cause to be calm or quiet as by administering a sedative to. <i><b>Calm</b> seas.</i>
<b>calming</b>	The act of appeasing (as by acceding to the demands of). Steadiness of mind under stress.
<b><u>calmness</u></b>	<i>This relative <b>calmness</b> ended at around 7 a m when the wind picked up speed.</i>
<b>composed</b>	Serenely self-possessed and free from agitation especially in times of stress. <i>The performer seemed completely <b>composed</b> as she stepped onto the stage.</i>
<b>composure</b>	The state or feeling of being calm and in control of oneself. <i>She was struggling to regain her <b>composure</b>.</i>
<b>coolheaded</b>	Marked by calm self-control (especially in trying circumstances); unemotional. <i>Stayed <b>coolheaded</b> in the crisis.</i>
<b>equanimity</b>	Steadiness of mind under stress. <i>She accepted both the good and the bad with <b>equanimity</b>.</i>
<b>halcyon</b>	A large kingfisher widely distributed in warmer parts of the Old World. <i>The <b>halcyon</b> days of the clipper trade.</i>
<b><u>hush</u></b>	Tranquil silence. <i>Management took steps to <b>hush</b> up the dangers.</i>
<b><u>idyllic</u></b>	Suggestive of an idyll; charmingly simple and serene. <i>An <b>idyllic</b> spot for a picnic.</i>
<b>noiseless</b>	Making no sound- Shakespeare. <i>Th inaudible and <b>noiseless</b> foot of time.</i>
<b>nonviolence</b>	Peaceful resistance to a government by fasting or refusing to cooperate.
<b>nonviolent</b>	Abstaining (on principle) from the use of violence.
<b>pacific</b>	The largest ocean in the world. <i>The <b>pacific</b> temper seeks to settle disputes on grounds of justice rather than by force.</i>
<b>peaceful</b>	Peacefully resistant in response to injustice. <i>She said her dad was a <b>peaceful</b> man who was always happy.</i>
<b>peacetime</b>	A period of time during which there is no war. <i>In <b>peacetime</b> regiments were billeted upon towns and villages.</i>

<b>placid</b>	Not easily irritated. <i>Not everyone shared his <b>placid</b> temperament.</i>
<b>quietude</b>	A state of peace and quiet. <i>It highlights her <b>quietude</b> and wise passivity.</i>
<b>restful</b>	Having a quiet and soothing quality. <i>She spent a <b>restful</b> night at home.</i>
<b>sedate</b>	Cause to be calm or quiet as by administering a sedative to. <i><b>Sedate</b> suburban domesticity.</i>
<b>serene</b>	Completely clear and fine. <i>Not a cloud obscured the deep <b>serene</b>.</i>
<b>serenity</b>	A disposition free from stress or emotion. <i>An oasis of <b>serenity</b> amidst the bustling city.</i>
<b>stillness</b>	The absence of movement or sound. <i>An eerie <b>stillness</b> engulfed the camp.</i>
<b>tranquil</b>	(of a body of water) free from disturbance by heavy waves. <i><b>Tranquil</b> life in the country.</i>
<b>tranquility</b>	A state of peace and quiet.
<b>tranquilize</b>	Make calm or still.
<b>tranquillity</b>	A state of peace and quiet. <i>Passing cars are the only noise that disturbs the <b>tranquillity</b> of rural life.</i>
<b>unarmed</b>	(used of plants or animals) lacking barbs or stings or thorns. <i>He was shooting <b>unarmed</b> civilians.</i>
<b>unflappable</b>	Having or showing calmness in a crisis. <i>I prided myself on being <b>unflappable</b> even in the most chaotic circumstances.</i>
