An act of performing a dramatic role, song, or piece of music.
*Bailey gives a sound **performance** as the doctor.*

- accomplish** Put in effect.
*The planes **accomplished** their mission.*
Successfully bring about or reach (a desired objective or result) by effort, skill, or courage.
- achieve** *He **achieved** his ambition to become a press photographer.*
- attain** Reach a point in time, or a certain state or level.
*Clarify your objectives and ways of **attaining** them.*
- clinch** Fasten a rope or angling line with a clinch knot.
*The Texan wanted to impress him to **clinch** a business deal.*
- consensus** Agreement in the judgment or opinion reached by a group as a whole.

execution	The act of accomplishing some aim or executing some order. <i>The film is entirely professional in its execution.</i>
fill	Fill satisfy or meet a want or need or condition or restriction. <i>The next few days were filled with meetings.</i>
firmness	The property of being unyielding to the touch. <i>The firmness of his hand on my chest.</i>
fulfill	Fill, satisfy or meet a want or need or condition or restriction.
fulfillment	A feeling of satisfaction at having achieved your desires.
goal	A cage or basket used as a goal in other sports. <i>The aircraft bumped towards our goal some 400 miles to the west.</i>
imposition	A tax or duty. <i>He listened but resented the imposition.</i>
indulging	The act of indulging or gratifying a desire.
infliction	The action of inflicting something unpleasant or painful on someone or something. <i>What an infliction he must be.</i>
injunction	An authoritative warning or order. <i>Injunction were formerly obtained by writ but now by a judicial order.</i>
jubilant	Feeling or expressing great happiness and triumph. <i>A large number of jubilant fans ran on to the pitch.</i>
mission	A group of people sent on a mission. <i>A confidential mission to London.</i>
practice	Carry out or practice as of jobs and professions. <i>It must have taken a lot of practice to become so fluent.</i>
process	An instance of a program being executed in a multitasking operating system typically running in an environment that protects it from other processes. <i>Process iron.</i>
resolution	The number of pixels per square inch on a computer generated display the greater the resolution the better the picture. <i>A successful resolution to the problem.</i>

revel	Get great pleasure from (a situation or experience). <i>Bill said he was secretly revelling in his new found fame.</i>
satisfaction	Christ's atonement for sin. <i>We were unable to get satisfaction from the local store.</i>
satisfactorily	In a satisfactory manner. <i>The plan has not worked satisfactorily.</i>
successfully	With success; in a successful manner. <i>She has successfully completed her mission.</i>
task	Assign a task to. <i>I tasked him with looking after the children.</i>
triumph	The processional entry of a victorious general into ancient Rome. <i>The king returned home in triumph.</i>
turnkey	A jailer. <i>Turnkey systems for telecommunications customers.</i>
