follow out	Grasp the meaning.	
follow through	Work in a specific place, with a specific subject, or in a specific function.	
follow up	Follow with the eyes or the mind.	
go through with Progress by being changed.		
put through	Put into a certain place or abstract location.	






Usage Examples of "Implements" as a verb

Associations of "Implements" (30 Words)

administration	The action of dispensing, giving, or applying something. The inhabitants of the island voted to remain under French administration .
advocacy	Active support of an idea or cause etc.; especially the act of pleading or arguing for something. His outspoken advocacy of the agreement has won no friends.
agenda	The underlying intentions or motives of a particular person or group. <i>He vowed to put jobs at the top of his agenda.</i>
antitrust	Of laws and regulations; designed to protect trade and commerce from unfair business practices.
apply	Apply oneself to. You need to apply to the local authority for a grant.
autarchy	A political system governed by a single individual.



authorities	The organization that is the governing authority of a political unit. The matter was referred to higher authorities .
bureau	An office or department for transacting particular business. The London bureau of the Washington Post.
<u>chairman</u>	The permanent or long-term president of a committee, company, or other organization. <i>The party chairman</i> .
<u>charter</u>	Grant a charter to. <i>He described the act as a charter for vandals.</i>
<u>decree</u>	The issuing of a decree. The president decree d that the military was to be streamlined.
deregulation	The act of freeing from regulation (especially from governmental regulations. Banks were allowed to grant mortgages following financial deregulation .
enforce	Ensure observance of laws and rules. There is no outside agency to enforce cooperation between the players.
enforcement	The act of enforcing; ensuring observance of or obedience to. The strict enforcement of environmental regulations.
expansionist	Of or involving or guided by expansionism. The imperial government became increasingly bent on expansionist policies.
extraterritorial	Situated outside a country's territory. Foreign embassies have extraterritorial rights.
fed	Any federal law enforcement officer.
federal	Any federal law enforcement officer. <i>Federal</i> courts.
<u>government</u>	Government the system or form by which a community or other political unit is governed. <i>Successive Labour governments.</i>
impose	Impose and collect. Sanctions impose d on South Africa.
jurisdiction	The extent of the power to make legal decisions and judgements. In some jurisdictions there is a mandatory death sentence for murder.
law	The branch of philosophy concerned with the law and the principles that lead courts to make the decisions they do. <i>Law</i> students.



legislation	Law enacted by a legislative body. It will require legislation to change this situation.
legislative	Having the power to make laws. <i>The country s supreme legislative body.</i>
militarism	The belief that a country should maintain a strong military capability and be prepared to use it aggressively to defend or promote national interests. <i>The need for liberal democratic reforms to avoid a revival of militarism</i> .
organization	The way in which the elements of a whole are arranged. A research organization .
policy	A course or principle of action adopted or proposed by an organization or individual. You should have read the small print on your policy .
polity	A form or process of civil government or constitution. <i>We was innocent of stratagems and polity.</i>
protocol	Rules determining the format and transmission of data. Safety protocol s.
refund	A repayment of a sum of money. If you re not delighted with your purchase we guarantee to refund your money in full.
