Definitions of "Implements" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “implements” as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *Ensure observance of laws and rules.*
- *Pursue to a conclusion or bring to a successful issue.*
- *Apply in a manner consistent with its purpose or design.*
- *Ensure observance of laws and rules.*



Synonyms of "Implements" as a verb (8 Words)

apply	Apply to a surface. <i>Normal rules apply.</i>
carry out	Transmit or serve as the medium for transmission.
enforce	Ensure observance of laws and rules. <i>There is no outside agency to enforce cooperation between the players.</i>
follow out	Grasp the meaning.
follow through	Work in a specific place, with a specific subject, or in a specific function.
follow up	Follow with the eyes or the mind.
go through with	Progress by being changed.
put through	Put into a certain place or abstract location.

administration	The action of dispensing, giving, or applying something. <i>The inhabitants of the island voted to remain under French administration.</i>

autarchy	A political system governed by a single individual.

authorities	The organization that is the governing authority of a political unit. <i>The matter was referred to higher authorities.</i>
bureau	An office or department for transacting particular business. <i>The London bureau of the Washington Post.</i>
chairman	The permanent or long-term president of a committee, company, or other organization. <i>The party chairman.</i>
charter	Grant a charter to. <i>He described the act as a charter for vandals.</i>
decree	The issuing of a decree. <i>The president decreed that the military was to be streamlined.</i>
deregulation	The act of freeing from regulation (especially from governmental regulations). <i>Banks were allowed to grant mortgages following financial deregulation.</i>
enforce	Ensure observance of laws and rules. <i>There is no outside agency to enforce cooperation between the players.</i>
enforcement	The act of enforcing; ensuring observance of or obedience to. <i>The strict enforcement of environmental regulations.</i>
expansionist	Of or involving or guided by expansionism. <i>The imperial government became increasingly bent on expansionist policies.</i>
extraterritorial	Situated outside a country's territory. <i>Foreign embassies have extraterritorial rights.</i>
fed	Any federal law enforcement officer.
federal	Any federal law enforcement officer. <i>Federal courts.</i>
government	Government the system or form by which a community or other political unit is governed. <i>Successive Labour governments.</i>
impose	Impose and collect. <i>Sanctions imposed on South Africa.</i>
jurisdiction	The extent of the power to make legal decisions and judgements. <i>In some jurisdictions there is a mandatory death sentence for murder.</i>
law	The branch of philosophy concerned with the law and the principles that lead courts to make the decisions they do. <i>Law students.</i>

legislation	Law enacted by a legislative body. <i>It will require legislation to change this situation.</i>
legislative	Having the power to make laws. <i>The country s supreme legislative body.</i>
militarism	The belief that a country should maintain a strong military capability and be prepared to use it aggressively to defend or promote national interests. <i>The need for liberal democratic reforms to avoid a revival of militarism.</i>
organization	The way in which the elements of a whole are arranged. <i>A research organization.</i>
policy	A course or principle of action adopted or proposed by an organization or individual. <i>You should have read the small print on your policy.</i>
polity	A form or process of civil government or constitution. <i>We was innocent of stratagems and polity.</i>
protocol	Rules determining the format and transmission of data. <i>Safety protocols.</i>
refund	A repayment of a sum of money. <i>If you re not delighted with your purchase we guarantee to refund your money in full.</i>
