(of an organization) affiliated to (a larger organization. All art schools whether independent or <b>attached</b> to universities.
Involved in or affected by or having a claim to or share in. Greatly <b>concerned</b> not to disappoint a small child.
(of parts) united so as to form a single part. <b>Connate</b> qualities.
The fact of being descended from the same ancestor. <i>The marriage was annulled on grounds of <b>consanguinity</b>.</i>
Mutually related.
A statistic representing how closely two variables co vary it can vary from 1 perfect negative correlation through 0 no correlation to 1 perfect positive correlation. <i>The increasingly similar basis underlying national soil maps allows</i> <b>correlation</b> to take place more easily.
A word or concept that has a mutual relationship with another word or concept. Rights whether moral or legal can involve <b>correlative</b> duties.
Closed in or surrounded or included within. A dark <b>enclosed</b> space.
As a fact or based on fact. <i>His assertion is <b>factually</b> incorrect.</i>
In a way that relates to origin or development. <i>Hair colour is <b>genetically</b> determined.</i>
An estimate based on little or no information. Answering this question will involve you in a certain amount of <b>guesswork</b> .
Contained as part of a whole being considered. All of Europe Britain <b>included</b> .
Without having had direct experience; at second hand. Both writers refer if only <b>indirectly</b> to a wealth of other art.



interested	Showing curiosity or concern about something or someone; having a feeling of interest. I had always been <b>interested</b> in history.
interrelationship	Mutual or reciprocal relation or relatedness. <b>Interrelationship</b> s of animal structure and function.
<u>involved</u>	Emotionally involved. The plot was too <b>involved</b> .
kin	A person having kinship with another or others. <i>He was <b>kin</b> to the brothers.</i>
kindred	Similar in quality or character. Books on <b>kindred</b> subjects.
linked	Connected by a link, as railway cars or trailer trucks.
paternal	Related through the father. <i>He reasserted his <b>paternal</b> authority.</i>
<u>pertain</u>	Be in effect or existence in a specified place or at a specified time. <i>The shop premises and stock and all assets</i> <b>pertain</b> <i>ing to the business.</i>
positively	In a positive way, especially by expressing optimism, agreement, or acceptance. This is <b>positively</b> the last word on the matter.
referent	Something that refers; a term that refers to another term. Judgments <b>referent</b> to the indictment.
<u>relate</u>	Feel sympathy for or identify with. The new legislation <b>relate</b> d to corporate activities.
related	Being connected either logically or causally or by shared characteristics. <b>Related</b> to micelle formation is the ability of detergent actives to congregate at oil water interfaces.
relevancy	The relation of something to the matter at hand.
subjectivity	The quality of existing in someone's mind rather than the external world. He is the first to acknowledge the <b>subjectivity</b> of memories.
