**affect** Connect closely and often incriminatingly.  
*The dampness began to **affect** my health.*

<b><u>affiliated</u></b>	(of a subsidiary group or a person) officially attached or connected to an organization. <i>Microsoft and its <b>affiliated</b> companies.</i>
<b>appertain</b>	Be a part or attribute of. <i>The answers generally <b>appertain</b> to improvements in standard of service.</i>
<b>attached</b>	(of an organization) affiliated to (a larger organization). <i>All art schools whether independent or <b>attached</b> to universities.</i>
<b>concerned</b>	Involved in or affected by or having a claim to or share in. <i>Greatly <b>concerned</b> not to disappoint a small child.</i>
<b>connate</b>	(of parts) united so as to form a single part. <i><b>Connate</b> qualities.</i>
<b>consanguinity</b>	The fact of being descended from the same ancestor. <i>The marriage was annulled on grounds of <b>consanguinity</b>.</i>
<b><u>correlated</u></b>	Mutually related.
<b>correlation</b>	A statistic representing how closely two variables co vary it can vary from 1 perfect negative correlation through 0 no correlation to 1 perfect positive correlation. <i>The increasingly similar basis underlying national soil maps allows <b>correlation</b> to take place more easily.</i>
<b>correlative</b>	A word or concept that has a mutual relationship with another word or concept. <i>Rights whether moral or legal can involve <b>correlative</b> duties.</i>
<b><u>enclosed</u></b>	Closed in or surrounded or included within. <i>A dark <b>enclosed</b> space.</i>
<b>factually</b>	As a fact or based on fact. <i>His assertion is <b>factually</b> incorrect.</i>
<b>genetically</b>	In a way that relates to origin or development. <i>Hair colour is <b>genetically</b> determined.</i>
<b>guesswork</b>	An estimate based on little or no information. <i>Answering this question will involve you in a certain amount of <b>guesswork</b>.</i>
<b>included</b>	Contained as part of a whole being considered. <i>All of Europe Britain <b>included</b>.</i>
<b><u>indirectly</u></b>	Without having had direct experience; at second hand. <i>Both writers refer if only <b>indirectly</b> to a wealth of other art.</i>

<b>interested</b>	Showing curiosity or concern about something or someone; having a feeling of interest. <i>I had always been <b>interested</b> in history.</i>
<b>interrelationship</b>	Mutual or reciprocal relation or relatedness. <i><b>Interrelationships</b> of animal structure and function.</i>
<b>involved</b>	Emotionally involved. <i>The plot was too <b>involved</b>.</i>
<b>kin</b>	A person having kinship with another or others. <i>He was <b>kin</b> to the brothers.</i>
<b>kindred</b>	Similar in quality or character. <i>Books on <b>kindred</b> subjects.</i>
<b>linked</b>	Connected by a link, as railway cars or trailer trucks.
<b>paternal</b>	Related through the father. <i>He reasserted his <b>paternal</b> authority.</i>
<b>pertain</b>	Be in effect or existence in a specified place or at a specified time. <i>The shop premises and stock and all assets <b>pertaining</b> to the business.</i>
<b>positively</b>	In a positive way, especially by expressing optimism, agreement, or acceptance. <i>This is <b>positively</b> the last word on the matter.</i>
<b>referent</b>	Something that refers; a term that refers to another term. <i>Judgments <b>referent</b> to the indictment.</i>
<b>relate</b>	Feel sympathy for or identify with. <i>The new legislation <b>related</b> to corporate activities.</i>
<b>related</b>	Being connected either logically or causally or by shared characteristics. <i><b>Related</b> to micelle formation is the ability of detergent actives to congregate at oil water interfaces.</i>
<b>relevancy</b>	The relation of something to the matter at hand.
<b>subjectivity</b>	The quality of existing in someone's mind rather than the external world. <i>He is the first to acknowledge the <b>subjectivity</b> of memories.</i>
