- *Impress positively.*
- *Dye (fabric) before it is spun.*
- *Produce or try to produce a vivid impression of.*
- *Apply (a mark) to something with pressure.*



- *Make (someone) feel admiration and respect.*
- *Reproduce by printing.*
- *Apply (an electric current or potential) from an external source.*

<a href="#"><u>engrave</u></a>	Carve or cut into a block used for printing or print from such a block. <i><b>Engraved</b> the trophy cup with the winner s name.</i>
<b>establish in someone's mind</b>	Bring about.
<b>etch</b>	Make an etching of. <i>The outline of the town was <b>etched</b> against the sky.</i>
<a href="#"><u>excite</u></a>	Cause to be agitated excited or roused. <i><b>Excite</b> the audience.</i>
<b>fix deeply in someone's mind</b>	Prepare for eating by applying heat.
<a href="#"><u>galvanize</u></a>	Coat (iron or steel) with a protective layer of zinc. <i>They promised they would <b>galvanize</b> the iron railings to prevent rusting.</i>
<b>have an impact on</b>	Serve oneself to, or consume regularly.
<a href="#"><u>imprint</u></a>	Impress or stamp (a mark or outline) on a surface. <i>Tyre marks were <b>imprinted</b> in the snow.</i>
<b>inculcate in</b>	Teach and impress by frequent repetitions or admonitions.
<b>influence</b>	Have an influence on. <i>Government regulations can <b>influence</b> behaviour but often without changing underlying values and motivations.</i>
<b>ingrain</b>	Thoroughly work in. <i>Mother tried to <b>ingrain</b> respect for our elders in us.</i>
<b>inscribe</b>	Write, engrave, or print as a lasting record. <i>A regular polygon <b>inscribed</b> in a circle.</i>
<b>inspire</b>	Give rise to. <i>Their past record does not <b>inspire</b> confidence.</i>
<a href="#"><u>instill</u></a>	Fill, as with a certain quality. <i><b>Instill</b> medication into my eye.</i>

<b>knock into</b>	Knock against with force or violence.
<b>leave a mark on</b>	Remove oneself from an association with or participation in.

<b>make an impression on</b>	Engage in.
<b>mark</b>	Put a check mark on or near or next to. <i><b>Mark</b> homework.</i>
<b>move</b>	Change location move travel or proceed also metaphorically. <i>He <b>moved</b> his hand slightly to the right.</i>
<b>print</b>	Put into print. <i>A thousand copies of the book were <b>printed</b>.</i>
<b>punch</b>	Drive forcibly as if by a punch. <i>He <b>punched</b> me in the stomach.</i>
<b>rouse</b>	Cause to be agitated excited or roused. <i>She d just stay a few more minutes then <b>rouse</b> herself and go back.</i>
<b>shanghai</b>	Force (someone) to join a ship lacking a full crew by drugging them or using other underhand means. <i>They specialized in drugging and robbing sailors sometimes arranging for them to be <b>shanghaied</b> aboard tramp boats.</i>
<b>stamp</b>	Destroy or extinguish as if by stamping with the foot. <i>She <b>stamped</b> the snow from her boots.</i>
<b>stir</b>	Stir feelings in. <i>Desmond <b>stirred</b> his tea and ate a biscuit.</i>
<b>stress to</b>	Put stress on; utter with an accent.
<b><u>strike</u></b>	Undertake strike action against an employer. <i>I will <b>strike</b> his name from the list.</i>
<b>yarn-dye</b>	Dye (fabric) before it is spun.

<b>curiously</b>	With curiosity. The sentence is <b>curiously</b> worded.
<b><u>daze</u></b>	Overcome as with astonishment or disbelief. She was <b>dazed</b> by his revelations.
<b>efficiently</b>	With efficiency; in an efficient manner. He functions <b>efficiently</b> .
<b>favorably</b>	Showing approval. He reviewed the play <b>favorably</b> .
<b><u>flabbergasted</u></b>	As if struck dumb with astonishment and surprise. This news has left me totally <b>flabbergasted</b> .
<b><u>imprint</u></b>	A device produced by pressure on a surface. He d always have this ghastly image <b>imprinted</b> on his mind.
<b>incline</b>	An inclined surface connecting two levels. I <b>incline</b> to the view that this conclusion is untenable.
<b>incredible</b>	Difficult to believe; extraordinary. At <b>incredible</b> speed.
<b><u>marvelous</u></b>	Extraordinarily good or great; used especially as intensifiers. A <b>marvelous</b> collection of rare books.
<b>redoubtable</b>	Inspiring fear. Born of a <b>redoubtable</b> family.
<b>satisfactorily</b>	In a way that fulfils expectations or needs; acceptably. The matter is considered to be <b>satisfactorily</b> resolved.

<b>successfully</b>	In a way that accomplishes a desired aim or result. <i>The plant operated <b>successfully</b> for seventy years.</i>
<b>surprised</b>	Taken unawares or suddenly and feeling wonder or astonishment. <i><b>Surprised</b> by her student's ingenuity.</i>
<b><u>surprising</u></b>	Causing surprise; unexpected. <i>Leaped up with <b>surprising</b> agility.</i>
<b><u>surprisingly</u></b>	In a way that causes surprise; unexpectedly. <i>Perhaps <b>surprisingly</b> all survived.</i>
