- *Easily impressed or influenced.*



## Synonyms of "Impressionable" as an adjective (9 Words)

- impressible** Easily impressed or influenced.
- malleable** Easily influenced.  
*Malleable* metals such as gold.
- persuadable** Being susceptible to persuasion.  
*They need to identify the most **persuadable** voters.*
- pliable** Capable of being bent or flexed or twisted without breaking.  
*Pliable* teenage minds.
- pliant** Easily influenced or directed; yielding.  
*Pliant* molten glass.
- receptive** Willing to consider or accept new suggestions and ideas.  
*Only the dominant male would have had access to the **receptive** female.*
- suggestible** Open to suggestion; easily swayed.  
*A **suggestible** client would comply.*

**susceptible** Likely or liable to be influenced or harmed by a particular thing.  
**Susceptible** *of proof.*

**waxy** Easily impressed or influenced.  
**Waxy** *potatoes.*





## Usage Examples of "Impressionable" as an adjective

- *Children are highly impressionable and susceptible to advertising.*
- *An impressionable age.*
- *An impressionable youngster.*

The capacity to be modified for a new use or purpose.  
*This is a good example of the **adaptability** of listed buildings.*

### [adaptable](#)

Able to adjust to new conditions.  
*The frame was **adaptable** to cloth bolts of different widths.*

### [adjustable](#)

Capable of being regulated.  
***Adjustable** interest rates.*

### **balmy**

Informal or slang terms for mentally irregular.  
*The **balmy** days of late summer.*

<b>clement</b>	(of weather) mild. <b>Clement</b> weather.
<b>delicate</b>	A delicate fabric or garment. <i>A surgeon s <b>delicate</b> touch.</i>
<b>ductile</b>	(of a metal) able to be drawn out into a thin wire. <b>Ductile</b> copper.
<b>ductility</b>	The malleability of something that can be drawn into threads or wires or hammered into thin sheets.
<b>elasticity</b>	Ability to change and adapt; adaptability. <i>Aging can decrease the <b>elasticity</b> of your skin.</i>
<b>flexibility</b>	Willingness to change or compromise. <i>Players gained improved <b>flexibility</b> in their ankles.</i>
<b><u>flexible</u></b>	Making or willing to make concessions. <i>A <b>flexible</b> personality.</i>
<b>labile</b>	(chemistry, physics, biology) readily undergoing change or breakdown. <i>The breakage of <b>labile</b> bonds.</i>
<b>limber</b>	Cause to become limber. <b>Limber</b> a cannon.
<b><u>malleable</u></b>	Easily influenced. <i>They are as <b>malleable</b> and easily led as sheep.</i>
<b><u>naive</u></b>	Of or created by one without formal training simple or naive in style. <i>The <b>naive</b> assumption that things can only get better.</i>
<b><u>pliable</u></b>	Capable of being bent or flexed or twisted without breaking. <i>Quality leather is <b>pliable</b> and will not crack.</i>
<b>pliant</b>	Capable of being bent or flexed or twisted without breaking. <i>A <b>pliant</b> nature.</i>
<b>reactive</b>	Reacting to a stimulus. <i>The skin of old persons is less <b>reactive</b> than that of younger persons.</i>
<b>responsiveness</b>	Responsive to stimulation. <i>The <b>responsiveness</b> of the vehicle.</i>
<b><u>sensitive</u></b>	(of a market) unstable and liable to quick changes of price because of outside influences. <i>I suppose I shouldn't be so <b>sensitive</b>.</i>
<b>soft</b>	Soft and mild not harsh or stern or severe. <i>A <b>soft</b> job.</i>
<b>susceptibility</b>	The state of being susceptible; easily affected. <i>Lack of exercise increases <b>susceptibility</b> to disease.</i>

<b><u>susceptible</u></b>	Easily impressed emotionally. <i>They only do it to tease him he s too <b>susceptible</b>.</i>
<b>tensile</b>	Capable of being shaped or bent or drawn out. <i>A <b>tensile</b> force.</i>
<b>touched</b>	Slightly mad; crazy. <i>Very <b>touched</b> by the stranger s kindness.</i>
<b><u>tractable</u></b>	Easily managed (controlled or taught or molded)- Samuel Butler. <i>She has always been <b>tractable</b> and obedient even as a child.</i>
<b>underside</b>	The lower side of anything. <i>The sordid <b>underside</b> of the glamorous 1980s.</i>
<b><u>vulnerable</u></b>	Exposed to the possibility of being attacked or harmed, either physically or emotionally. <i>An argument <b>vulnerable</b> to refutation.</i>
<b>waxy</b>	Having the paleness of wax. <i>A <b>waxy</b> mind.</i>
<b>yielding</b>	The act of conceding or yielding. <i>Too <b>yielding</b> to make a stand against any encroachments.</i>
