<b>grand</b>	(of a person) of high rank and behaving in an appropriately proud or dignified way. <b>Grand</b> theft.
<b>imposing</b>	Impressive in appearance. An <b>imposing</b> 17th century manor house.
<b>magnificent</b>	Extremely beautiful, elaborate, or impressive. A dramatic landscape of <b>magnificent</b> mountains.
<b>majestic</b>	Majestic in manner or bearing superior to mundane matters. His <b>majestic</b> presence.
<b>masterly</b>	Having or revealing supreme mastery or skill. A <b>masterly</b> performance of the sonata.
<b>skilful</b>	Having or showing skill. A <b>skilful</b> midfielder.
<b>skilled</b>	(of work) requiring special abilities or training. <b>Skilled</b> legal advice.
<b>spectacular</b>	Strikingly large or obvious. <b>Spectacular</b> mountain scenery.
<b>splendid</b>	Magnificent; very impressive. A <b>splendid</b> fellow.
<b>stirring</b>	Capable of arousing enthusiasm or excitement. <b>Stirring</b> events such as wars and rescues.
<b>stunning</b>	Causing great astonishment and consternation. A <b>stunning</b> detonation with volumes of black smoke.
<b>telling</b>	Disclosing unintentionally. A <b>telling</b> gesture.

<b>exceeding</b>	Extremely exceedingly. <i>She spoke warmly of his <b>exceeding</b> kindness.</i>
<b>grand</b>	A grand piano. <i><b>Grand</b> theft.</i>
<b>imposing</b>	Impressive in appearance. <i>An <b>imposing</b> residence.</i>
<b><u>lavish</u></b>	Give someone generous amounts of. <i>He was <b>lavished</b> with gifts.</i>
<b>luxury</b>	Luxurious or of the nature of a luxury. <i>A <b>luxury</b> yacht.</i>
<b>magisterial</b>	Of or relating to a magistrate. <i>Managed the employees in an aloof <b>magisterial</b> way.</i>
<b>majestic</b>	Majestic in manner or bearing superior to mundane matters. <i>The <b>majestic</b> Canadian Rockies.</i>
<b>moving</b>	In motion. <i>A constantly <b>moving</b> crowd.</i>
<b>opulence</b>	Great wealth or luxuriousness. <i>Rooms of spectacular <b>opulence</b>.</i>
<b><u>opulent</u></b>	Ostentatiously rich and superior in quality. <i>His more <b>opulent</b> tenants.</i>
<b>palatial</b>	Resembling a palace in being spacious and splendid. <i><b>Palatial</b> furnishings.</i>
<b>prosperity</b>	The state of being prosperous. <i>A long period of peace and <b>prosperity</b>.</i>
<b>saintliness</b>	The quality or state of being saintly; holiness. <i>Her selfless behaviour borders on <b>saintliness</b>.</i>
<b><u>sensational</u></b>	Commanding attention. <i>You look <b>sensational</b>.</i>
<b><u>spectacular</u></b>	Having a quality that thrusts itself into attention. <i>The party suffered a <b>spectacular</b> loss in the election.</i>
<b>splendid</b>	Characterized by grandeur. <i>A <b>splendid</b> view of Windsor Castle.</i>
<b><u>staggering</u></b>	Deeply shocking; astonishing. <i>The <b>staggering</b> bills for maintenance and repair.</i>

- stately** Impressive or grand in size, appearance, or manner.  
*A **stately** procession.*
- striking** The action of striking.  
*Substantial damage was caused by the **striking** of a submerged object.*
- stunning** Commanding attention.  
*The strike came as a **stunning** protest against management.*
- sumptuous** Rich and superior in quality.  
*The banquet was a **sumptuous** luxurious meal.*
- thundering** Making a resounding, loud, deep noise.  
*A **thundering** good read.*
- touching** Arousing affect.  
*Your loyalty is very **touching**.*
