According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “impressive” as an adjective can have the following definitions:

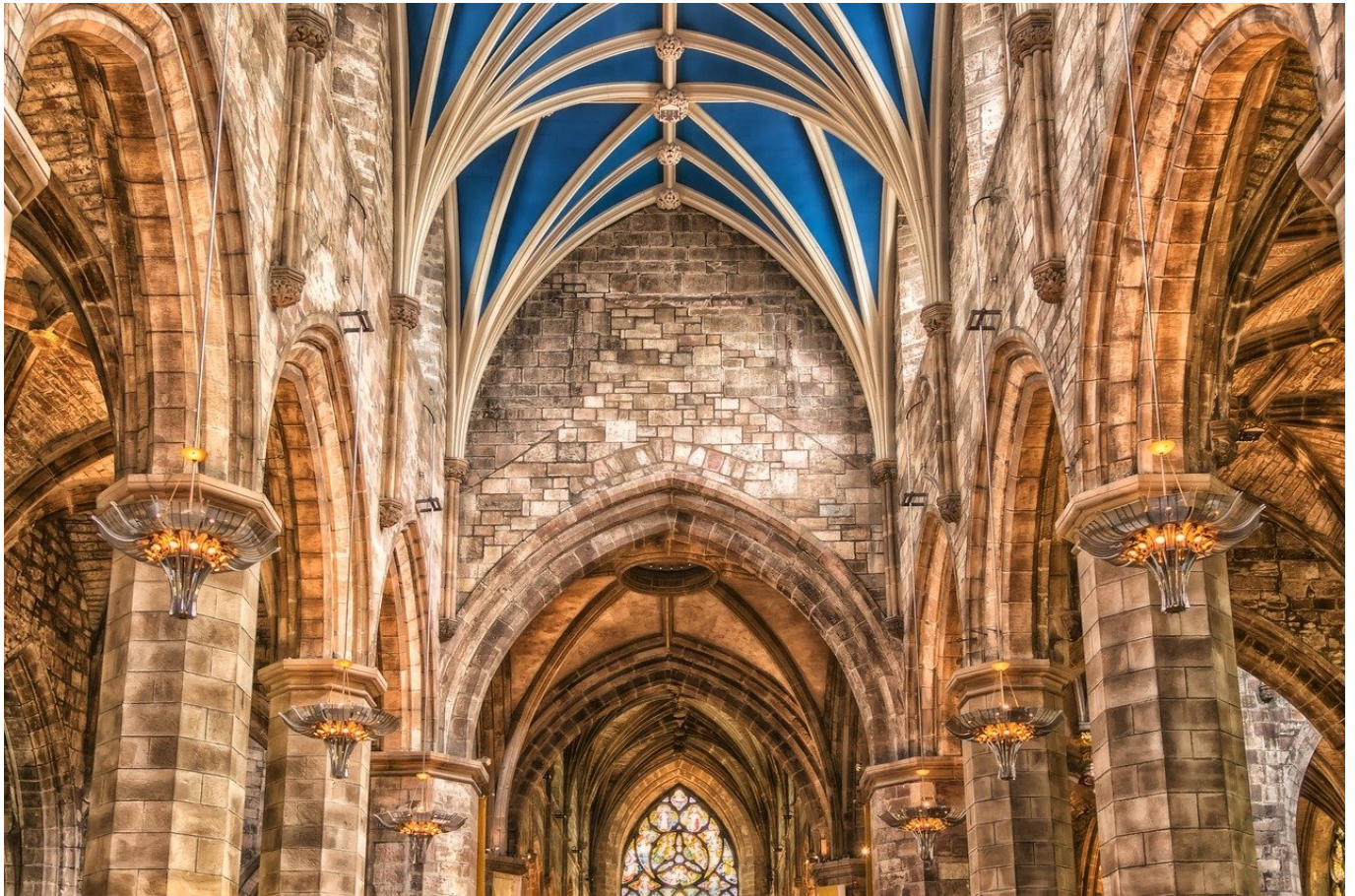
- *Evoking admiration through size, quality, or skill; grand, imposing, or awesome.*

Synonyms of "Impressive" as an adjective (19 Words)

accomplished	Settled securely and unconditionally. <i>His mission accomplished he took a vacation.</i>
<u>admirable</u>	Inspiring admiration or approval. <i>His taste was impeccable his health admirable.</i>
august	Profoundly honored. <i>Of august lineage.</i>
awe-inspiring	Inspiring awe or admiration or wonder.
<u>brehtaking</u>	Astonishing or awe-inspiring in quality, so as to take one's breath away. <i>Breathtaking adventure.</i>
consummate	Showing great skill and flair. <i>Consummate skill.</i>
expert	Having or involving a great deal of knowledge or skill in a particular area. <i>He had received expert academic advice.</i>

grand	(of a person) of high rank and behaving in an appropriately proud or dignified way. Grand theft.
imposing	Impressive in appearance. An imposing 17th century manor house.
magnificent	Extremely beautiful, elaborate, or impressive. A dramatic landscape of magnificent mountains.
majestic	Majestic in manner or bearing superior to mundane matters. His majestic presence.
masterly	Having or revealing supreme mastery or skill. A masterly performance of the sonata.
skilful	Having or showing skill. A skilful midfielder.
skilled	(of work) requiring special abilities or training. Skilled legal advice.
spectacular	Strikingly large or obvious. Spectacular mountain scenery.
splendid	Magnificent; very impressive. A splendid fellow.
stirring	Capable of arousing enthusiasm or excitement. Stirring events such as wars and rescues.
stunning	Causing great astonishment and consternation. A stunning detonation with volumes of black smoke.
telling	Disclosing unintentionally. A telling gesture.

imposing	Impressive in appearance. <i>An imposing residence.</i>
<u>lavish</u>	Give someone generous amounts of. <i>He was lavished with gifts.</i>
luxury	Luxurious or of the nature of a luxury. <i>A luxury yacht.</i>
magisterial	Of or relating to a magistrate. <i>Managed the employees in an aloof magisterial way.</i>
majestic	Majestic in manner or bearing superior to mundane matters. <i>The majestic Canadian Rockies.</i>
moving	In motion. <i>A constantly moving crowd.</i>
opulence	Great wealth or luxuriousness. <i>Rooms of spectacular opulence.</i>
<u>opulent</u>	Ostentatiously rich and superior in quality. <i>His more opulent tenants.</i>
palatial	Resembling a palace in being spacious and splendid. <i>Palatial furnishings.</i>
prosperity	The state of being prosperous. <i>A long period of peace and prosperity.</i>
saintliness	The quality or state of being saintly; holiness. <i>Her selfless behaviour borders on saintliness.</i>
<u>sensational</u>	Commanding attention. <i>You look sensational.</i>
<u>spectacular</u>	Having a quality that thrusts itself into attention. <i>The party suffered a spectacular loss in the election.</i>
splendid	Characterized by grandeur. <i>A splendid view of Windsor Castle.</i>
<u>staggering</u>	Deeply shocking; astonishing. <i>The staggering bills for maintenance and repair.</i>

stately Impressive or grand in size, appearance, or manner.
*A **stately** procession.*

striking The action of striking.
*Substantial damage was caused by the **striking** of a submerged object.*

stunning Commanding attention.
*The strike came as a **stunning** protest against management.*

sumptuous Rich and superior in quality.
*The banquet was a **sumptuous** luxurious meal.*

thundering Making a resounding, loud, deep noise.
*A **thundering** good read.*

touching Arousing affect.
*Your loyalty is very **touching**.*
