Definitions of "Imprint" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “imprint” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A brand name under which books are published, typically the name of a former publishing house that is now part of a larger group.*
- *A concavity in a surface produced by pressing.*
- *A lasting effect.*
- *A device produced by pressure on a surface.*
- *An impression produced by pressure or printing.*
- *A distinctive influence.*
- *A mark or outline made by pressing something on to a softer substance.*
- *A printer's or publisher's name, address, and other details in a book or other publication.*
- *An identification of a publisher; a publisher's name along with the date and address*

and edition that is printed at the bottom of the title page.



Synonyms of "Imprint" as a noun (8 Words)

- depression** A period during the 1930s when there was a worldwide economic depression and mass unemployment.
*Hurricanes start off as loose regions of bad weather known as tropical **depressions**.*
- embossment** Sculpture consisting of shapes carved on a surface so as to stand out from the surrounding background.
- impact** The striking of one body against another.
*Our regional measures have had a significant **impact** on unemployment.*
- [impression](#)** An impressionistic portrayal of a person.
*The **impression** of his body on the leaves.*
- indentation** A concave cut into a surface or edge (as in a coastline).
*Paragraphs are marked off by **indentation**.*

influence One having power to influence another.
*Her wishes had a great **influence** on his thinking.*

mark A figure or letter representing the total number of marks awarded in an examination or competition and signifying a person's score.
*He blasted away from the field during the second lap to knock a second off the existing **mark**.*

print A picture or design printed from an engraving.
*Bold **print**.*

- *English stills bears the imprint of the Norman invasion.*

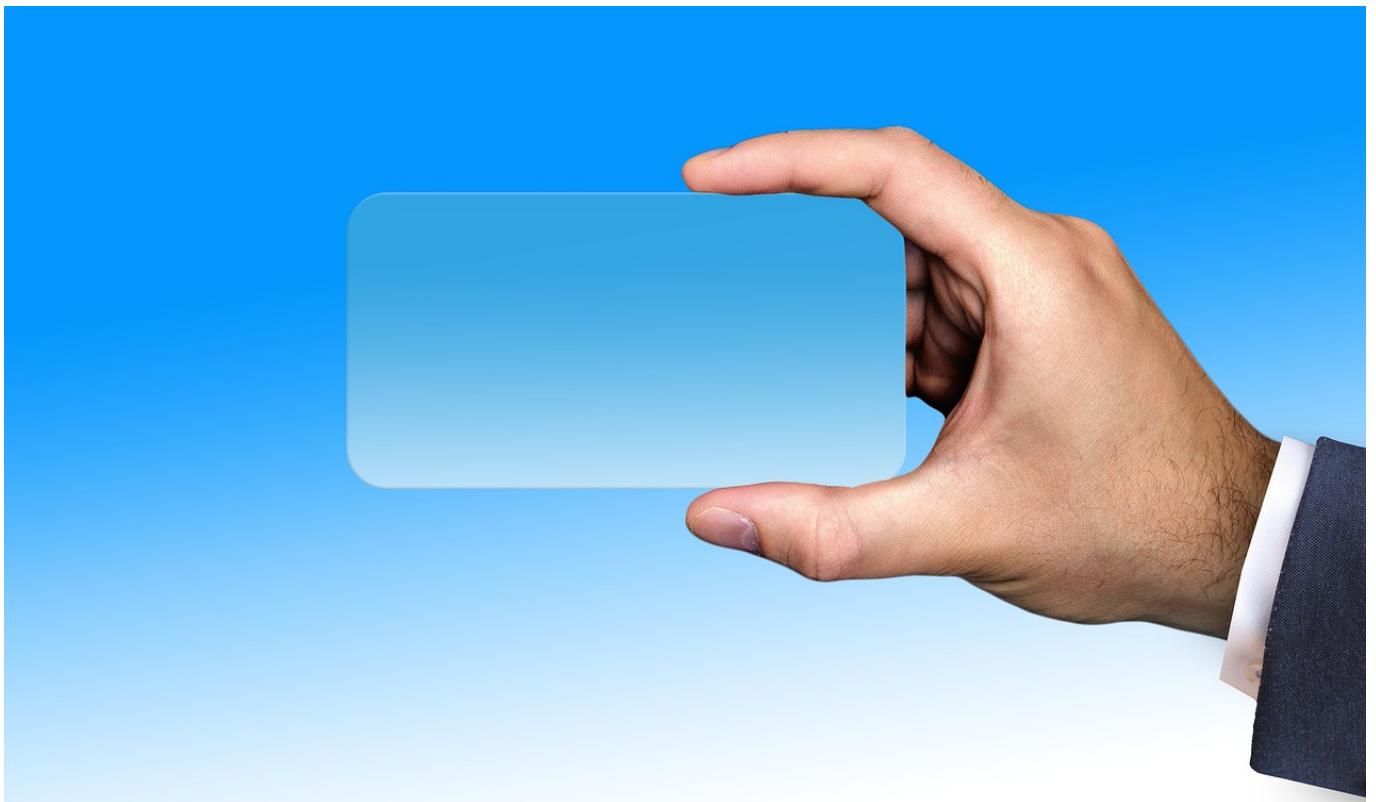


Imprint as a Verb

Definitions of "Imprint" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "imprint" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *(of a young animal) come to recognize (another animal, person, or thing) as a parent or other object of habitual trust.*
- *Fix (an idea) firmly in someone's mind.*
- *Make an impression or mark on.*
- *Impress or stamp (a mark or outline) on a surface.*
- *Establish or impress firmly in the mind.*
- *Mark or stamp with or as if with pressure.*

deboss Stamp a design into the surface of (an object).
*A blue awareness bracelet with a **debossed** logo.*

embed	Fix or set securely or deeply. <i>The young reporter was embedded with the Third Division.</i>
engrave	Impress or affect deeply. <i>Engraved the trophy cup with the winner s name.</i>
establish	Institute enact or establish. <i>The scheme was established in 1975.</i>
etch	Make an etching of. <i>The gallery has 12 000 prints engraved and etched by celebrated masters.</i>
fix	Decide upon or fix definitely. <i>She fixed her gaze on the man.</i>
form	Bring or be brought into a certain formation. <i>Social groups form everywhere.</i>
implant	Provide someone or something with something by implantation. <i>Electrodes had been implanted in his brain.</i>
impress	Impress positively. <i>Andean cultures used seals to impress designs on pottery.</i>
lodge	Be a lodger stay temporarily. <i>She was lodged in the same hall.</i>
mark	Make underscoring marks. <i>The incidents marked a new phase in the terrorist campaign.</i>
print	Produce text or a picture by a printing process. <i>His face was printed on her memory.</i>
punch	Drive forcibly as if by a punch. <i>I punched the button to summon the lift.</i>
stamp	Affix a stamp to. <i>John stamped off muttering.</i>
stick	Stick to firmly. <i>She sticks to her principles.</i>



Usage Examples of "Imprint" as a verb

- *The bird thought I was its mother and imprinted on me.*
- *We imprint our ideas onto our children.*
- *Clothes imprinted with the logos of sports teams.*
- *He'd always have this ghastly image imprinted on his mind.*

emphasis	Special importance, value, or prominence given to something. <i>He spoke with emphasis and with complete conviction.</i>
emphasize	Give special importance or value to (something) in speaking or writing. <i>I would emphasize that I am not an economist.</i>
emphasized	Spoken with emphasis.
<u>emphatically</u>	Without doubt; clearly. <i>Greg is emphatically not a slacker.</i>
favorably	Showing approval. <i>He reviewed the play favorably.</i>
highlight	Create highlights in hair. <i>A photocopy with sections highlighted in green.</i>
implant	A thing implanted in something else especially a piece of tissue prosthetic device or other object implanted in the body. <i>The dentist implanted a tooth in the gum.</i>
importance	The state or fact of being of great significance or value. <i>The importance of a well balanced diet.</i>
<u>impress</u>	Impress positively. <i>This child impressed me as unusually mature.</i>
intension	The internal content of a concept.
lilt	Speak sing or sound with a lilt. <i>The lilt of the Hawaiian music.</i>
overburden	The surface soil that must be moved away to get at coal seams and mineral deposits. <i>The kaolin is mined by removing the overburden and digging a pit.</i>
pains	An effortful attempt to attain a goal.
press	Create by pressing. <i>At the pressing of a button.</i>
pressure	To cause to do through pressure or necessity by physical moral or intellectual means. <i>The compressed gas exerts an increased pressure.</i>
sign	Place signs as along a road. <i>He signed to play the casino on Dec 18.</i>
<u>spotlight</u>	Illuminate with a spotlight as in the theater. <i>The protest spotlighted the overcrowding in British prisons.</i>

strain	Separate by passing through a sieve or other straining device to separate out coarser elements. <i>I stopped and listened straining my ears for any sound.</i>
stress	The degree of stress measured in units of force per unit area. <i>In many areas irrigation is warranted to avoid plant stress.</i>
<u>surprising</u>	Causing surprise or wonder or amazement. <i>A surprising sequence of events.</i>
tension	The degree of tightness of stitches in knitting and machine sewing. <i>It places great tension on the leg muscles.</i>
tighten	Become tight or tighter. <i>The rope tightened.</i>
<u>underline</u>	The line of the lower part of an animal's body. <i>The improvement in retail sales was underlined by these figures.</i>
<u>underscore</u>	Draw a line or lines underneath to call attention to. <i>The company underscored the progress made with fuel cells.</i>
