- An impression produced by pressure or printing.
- A distinctive influence.
- A mark or outline made by pressing something on to a softer substance.
- A printer's or publisher's name, address, and other details in a book or other publication.
- An identification of a publisher; a publisher's name along with the date and address






Imprint as a Verb

Definitions of "Imprint" as a verb

According to the Oxford Dictionary of English, "imprint" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- (of a young animal) come to recognize (another animal, person, or thing) as a parent or other object of habitual trust.
- Fix (an idea) firmly in someone's mind.
- Make an impression or mark on.
- Impress or stamp (a mark or outline) on a surface.
- Establish or impress firmly in the mind.
- Mark or stamp with or as if with pressure.






Usage Examples of "Imprint" as a verb
