### Definitions of "Imprint" as a noun

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), “imprint” as a noun can have the following definitions:

- *A brand name under which books are published, typically the name of a former publishing house that is now part of a larger group.*
- *A concavity in a surface produced by pressing.*
- *A lasting effect.*
- *A device produced by pressure on a surface.*
- *An impression produced by pressure or printing.*
- *A distinctive influence.*
- *A mark or outline made by pressing something on to a softer substance.*
- *A printer's or publisher's name, address, and other details in a book or other publication.*
- *An identification of a publisher; a publisher's name along with the date and address*

and edition that is printed at the bottom of the title page.



## Synonyms of "Imprint" as a noun (8 Words)

- depression** A period during the 1930s when there was a worldwide economic depression and mass unemployment.  
*Hurricanes start off as loose regions of bad weather known as tropical **depressions**.*
- embossment** Sculpture consisting of shapes carved on a surface so as to stand out from the surrounding background.
- impact** The striking of one body against another.  
*Our regional measures have had a significant **impact** on unemployment.*
- [impression](#)** An impressionistic portrayal of a person.  
*The **impression** of his body on the leaves.*
- indentation** A concave cut into a surface or edge (as in a coastline).  
*Paragraphs are marked off by **indentation**.*

**influence** One having power to influence another.  
*Her wishes had a great **influence** on his thinking.*

**mark** A figure or letter representing the total number of marks awarded in an examination or competition and signifying a person's score.  
*He blasted away from the field during the second lap to knock a second off the existing **mark**.*

**print** A picture or design printed from an engraving.  
*Bold **print**.*

- *English stills bears the imprint of the Norman invasion.*

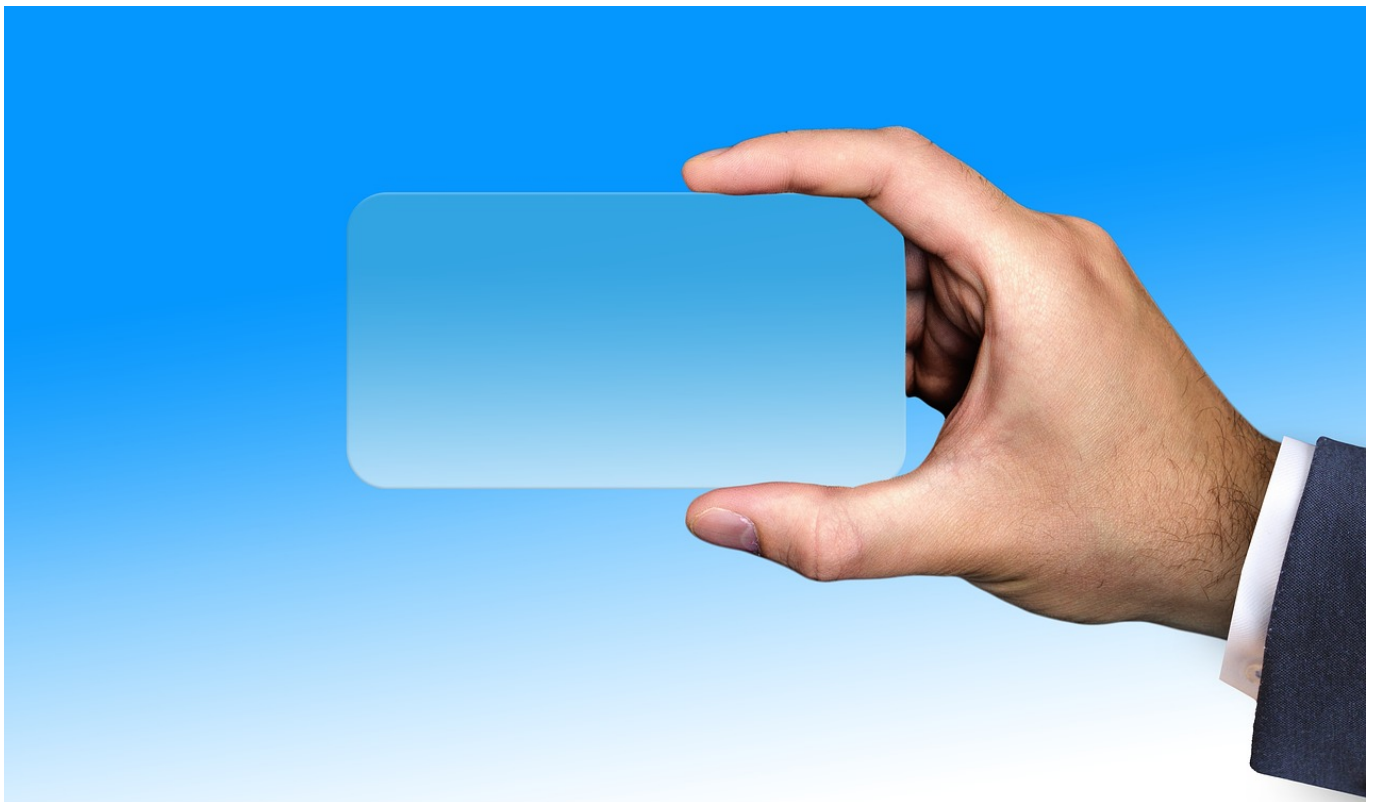


# Imprint as a Verb

## Definitions of "Imprint" as a verb

According to the [Oxford Dictionary of English](#), "imprint" as a verb can have the following definitions:

- *(of a young animal) come to recognize (another animal, person, or thing) as a parent or other object of habitual trust.*
- *Fix (an idea) firmly in someone's mind.*
- *Make an impression or mark on.*
- *Impress or stamp (a mark or outline) on a surface.*
- *Establish or impress firmly in the mind.*
- *Mark or stamp with or as if with pressure.*



## Synonyms of "Imprint" as a verb (15 Words)

**deboss** Stamp a design into the surface of (an object).  
*A blue awareness bracelet with a **debossed** logo.*

<b>embed</b>	Fix or set securely or deeply. <i>The young reporter was <b>embedded</b> with the Third Division.</i>
<b>engrave</b>	Impress or affect deeply. <i><b>Engraved</b> the trophy cup with the winner s name.</i>
<b>establish</b>	Institute enact or establish. <i>The scheme was <b>established</b> in 1975.</i>
<b>etch</b>	Make an etching of. <i>The gallery has 12 000 prints engraved and <b>etched</b> by celebrated masters.</i>
<b>fix</b>	Decide upon or fix definitely. <i>She <b>fixed</b> her gaze on the man.</i>
<b>form</b>	Bring or be brought into a certain formation. <i>Social groups <b>form</b> everywhere.</i>
<b>implant</b>	Provide someone or something with something by implantation. <i>Electrodes had been <b>implanted</b> in his brain.</i>
<b>impress</b>	Impress positively. <i>Andean cultures used seals to <b>impress</b> designs on pottery.</i>
<b>lodge</b>	Be a lodger stay temporarily. <i>She was <b>lodged</b> in the same hall.</i>
<b>mark</b>	Make underscoring marks. <i>The incidents <b>marked</b> a new phase in the terrorist campaign.</i>
<b>print</b>	Produce text or a picture by a printing process. <i>His face was <b>printed</b> on her memory.</i>
<b>punch</b>	Drive forcibly as if by a punch. <i>I <b>punched</b> the button to summon the lift.</i>
<b>stamp</b>	Affix a stamp to. <i>John <b>stamped</b> off muttering.</i>
<b>stick</b>	Stick to firmly. <i>She <b>sticks</b> to her principles.</i>

- *The bird thought I was its mother and imprinted on me.*
- *We imprint our ideas onto our children.*
- *Clothes imprinted with the logos of sports teams.*
- *He'd always have this ghastly image imprinted on his mind.*

<b>emphasis</b>	Special importance, value, or prominence given to something. <i>He spoke with <b>emphasis</b> and with complete conviction.</i>
<b>emphasize</b>	Give special importance or value to (something) in speaking or writing. <i>I would <b>emphasize</b> that I am not an economist.</i>
<b>emphasized</b>	Spoken with emphasis.
<b><u>emphatically</u></b>	Without doubt; clearly. <i>Greg is <b>emphatically</b> not a slacker.</i>
<b>favorably</b>	Showing approval. <i>He reviewed the play <b>favorably</b>.</i>
<b>highlight</b>	Create highlights in hair. <i>A photocopy with sections <b>highlighted</b> in green.</i>
<b>implant</b>	A thing implanted in something else especially a piece of tissue prosthetic device or other object implanted in the body. <i>The dentist <b>implanted</b> a tooth in the gum.</i>
<b>importance</b>	The state or fact of being of great significance or value. <i>The <b>importance</b> of a well balanced diet.</i>
<b><u>impress</u></b>	Impress positively. <i>This child <b>impressed</b> me as unusually mature.</i>
<b>intension</b>	The internal content of a concept.
<b>lilt</b>	Speak sing or sound with a lilt. <i>The <b>lilt</b> of the Hawaiian music.</i>
<b>overburden</b>	The surface soil that must be moved away to get at coal seams and mineral deposits. <i>The kaolin is mined by removing the <b>overburden</b> and digging a pit.</i>
<b>pains</b>	An effortful attempt to attain a goal.
<b>press</b>	Create by pressing. <i>At the <b>pressing</b> of a button.</i>
<b>pressure</b>	To cause to do through pressure or necessity by physical moral or intellectual means. <i>The compressed gas exerts an increased <b>pressure</b>.</i>
<b>sign</b>	Place signs as along a road. <i>He <b>signed</b> to play the casino on Dec 18.</i>
<b><u>spotlight</u></b>	Illuminate with a spotlight as in the theater. <i>The protest <b>spotlighted</b> the overcrowding in British prisons.</i>

<b>strain</b>	Separate by passing through a sieve or other straining device to separate out coarser elements. <i>I stopped and listened <b>straining</b> my ears for any sound.</i>
<b>stress</b>	The degree of stress measured in units of force per unit area. <i>In many areas irrigation is warranted to avoid plant <b>stress</b>.</i>
<b><u>surprising</u></b>	Causing surprise or wonder or amazement. <i>A <b>surprising</b> sequence of events.</i>
<b>tension</b>	The degree of tightness of stitches in knitting and machine sewing. <i>It places great <b>tension</b> on the leg muscles.</i>
<b>tighten</b>	Become tight or tighter. <i>The rope <b>tightened</b>.</i>
<b><u>underline</u></b>	The line of the lower part of an animal's body. <i>The improvement in retail sales was <b>underlined</b> by these figures.</i>
<b><u>underscore</u></b>	Draw a line or lines underneath to call attention to. <i>The company <b>underscored</b> the progress made with fuel cells.</i>
