Associations of "In charge" (30 Words)

account	A short account of the news. <i>She turned her writing skills to good account.</i>
admittance	The process or fact of entering or being allowed to enter a place or institution. <i>People were unable to gain admittance to the hall.</i>
annuitant	A person who receives an annuity.
bill	A poster or handbill. <i>We billed 400 000.</i>
<u>billing</u>	Request for payment of a debt. <i>He shared top billing with his wife.</i>
buck	Of a horse to perform a buck. <i>The dashing young buck driving his own equipage.</i>
<u>cash</u>	Exchange for cash. <i>A discount for cash.</i>
cost	(of an object or action) require the payment of (a specified sum of money) before it can be acquired or done. <i>He couldn't calculate the cost of the collection.</i>
deductible	The part of an insurance claim to be paid by the insured; an excess. <i>Childcare vouchers will be deductible expenses for employers.</i>
<u>deposit</u>	Matter that has been deposited by some natural process. <i>Areas of mineral deposits.</i>
disbursement	Amounts paid for goods and services that may be currently tax deductible (as opposed to capital expenditures). <i>The bill includes unpaid professional disbursements.</i>
dollar	A United States coin worth one dollar. <i>The dollar sign means little to him.</i>

entree	The principal dish of a meal. <i>She made a graceful entree into the ballroom.</i>
<u>expenditure</u>	The act of spending money for goods or services. <i>The expenditure of taxpayers money.</i>
expense	Offset an item of expenditure as an expense against taxable income. <i>At the expense of.</i>
fee	A fixed charge for a privilege or for professional services. <i>They were faced with legal fees of 3000.</i>
honorarium	A fee paid for a nominally free service.
installment	A part of a published serial.
invoice	Send an invoice for goods or services provided. <i>She invoiced the company for her expenses.</i>
levy	An act of levying a tax fee or fine. <i>The trade union political levy.</i>
outlay	An amount of money spent on something. <i>Comparatively little financial outlay.</i>
overcharge	Rip off; ask an unreasonable price. <i>Customers have been overcharged 12 million in the last year.</i>
prohibitive	(of a law or rule) forbidding or restricting something. <i>The price was prohibitive.</i>
rates	A local tax on property (usually used in the plural).
receivable	Able to be received. <i>Accounts receivable.</i>
reimbursement	Compensation paid (to someone) for damages or losses or money already spent etc. <i>The family received insurance reimbursements.</i>
remittance	A payment of money sent to a person in another place. <i>Remittance may be made by credit card.</i>
spending	The act of spending or disbursing money.
surcharge	Mark a postage stamp with a surcharge. <i>The air was surcharged with tension.</i>
<u>tithe</u>	Pay one tenth of pay tithes on especially to the church. <i>He tithes 10 per cent of his income to the Church.</i>
