however	To whatever degree or extent. <i>However you look at it you can t criticize that.</i>
indicative	The indicative mood. <i>Actions indicative of fear.</i>
indoor	Relating to sports played indoors. <i>Indoor sports.</i>
indoors	Within a building. <i>They went indoors and explored the house.</i>
inflect	Of a word or language undergo inflection. <i>Her analysis may have been inflected by the upsurge of feminism.</i>
inmost	Situated or occurring farthest within.

inner	A shot that strikes the inner. <i>An inner courtyard.</i>
inside	On the inside. <i>He reached into his inside jacket pocket.</i>
interior	Situated further in or within. <i>The plains of the interior.</i>
<u>internal</u>	Relating to affairs and activities within a country rather than with other countries; domestic. <i>Internal bleeding.</i>
intramural	Taking place within a single educational institution. <i>An intramural social symbol within the tribe.</i>
inwardly	Within the mind. <i>Inwardly seething he did as he was told.</i>
locative	The locative case.
noun	A word other than a pronoun used to identify any of a class of people places or things common noun or to name a particular one of these proper noun.
participle	A word formed from a verb e g going gone being been and used as an adjective e g working woman burnt toast or a noun e g good breeding In English participles are also used to make compound verb forms e g is going has been.
<u>predicate</u>	What is predicated of the subject of a proposition the second term in a proposition is predicated of the first term by means of the copula. <i>The predicate dog is predicated of the subject Fido in the sentence Fido is a dog.</i>
prefix	Add a prefix or introduction to something. <i>All three digit numbers will now be prefixed by 580.</i>
pronoun	A function word that is used in place of a noun or noun phrase.
suffix	Attach a suffix to. <i>Suffix words.</i>
<u>suggestive</u>	Tending to suggest something improper or indecent. <i>There were various suggestive pieces of evidence.</i>
verb	Use a word that is not conventionally used as a verb typically a noun as a verb. <i>Any English noun can be verbed but some are more resistant than others.</i>
within	Internally or inwardly. <i>Enquire within.</i>
