acceptation	A particular sense or the generally recognized meaning common acceptance of a word or phrase.
accepted	Generally approved or compelling recognition. <i>He wasn't handsome in the accepted sense.</i>
accustomed	In the habit of or adapted to. <i>His accustomed thoroughness.</i>
blandness	Lack of strong emotions, features, or characteristics. <i>The boneless chops were underseasoned to the point of blandness.</i>
commonly	Very often; frequently. <i>Shift workers commonly complain of not getting enough sleep.</i>
cosmopolitan	A cosmopolitan person. <i>Cosmopolitans who spoke both Spanish and English.</i>
entree	The right to enter. <i>She made a graceful entree into the ballroom.</i>
everywhere	In or to all places. <i>You find fast food stores everywhere.</i>
exponentially	By means of or as expressed by a mathematical exponent. <i>The coefficients show an exponentially decaying trend.</i>
generally	Without distinction of one from others. <i>A decade when France was moving generally to the left.</i>
inherent	(of an adjective) having the same meaning in both attributive and predicative uses. <i>Any form of mountaineering has its inherent dangers.</i>
known	Publicly acknowledged to be. <i>Plants little known to western science.</i>
mediocre	Of only average quality; not very good. <i>They improved the quality from mediocre to above average.</i>

norm	Adjust something to conform to a norm. <i>It set the norm for American homes.</i>
<u>normally</u>	Under normal or usual conditions; as a rule. <i>Try to breathe normally.</i>
ordinarily	In a normal way. <i>An effort to behave ordinarily.</i>
ordinary	A penny-farthing bicycle. <i>She seemed very ordinary.</i>
popularly	(of a term, name, or title) in informal, common, or non-specialist use. <i>Advancing age is popularly associated with a declining capacity to work.</i>
<u>prevail</u>	Be larger in number, quantity, power, status or importance. <i>She was prevailed upon to give an account of her work.</i>
quotidian	Of or occurring every day; daily. <i>The car sped noisily off through the quotidian traffic.</i>
routine	Organize according to a routine. <i>All had been routined with smoothness.</i>
<u>typically</u>	With the distinctive qualities of a particular type of person or thing. <i>A typically English village wedding.</i>
ubiquitous	Present, appearing, or found everywhere. <i>His ubiquitous influence was felt by all the family.</i>
ubiquity	The state of being everywhere at once (or seeming to be everywhere at once). <i>The growing ubiquity of advertising.</i>
unexceptional	Not special in any way. <i>A unexceptional incident as can be found in a lawyer's career.</i>
<u>universal</u>	A thing having universal effect, currency or application. <i>The incidents caused universal concern.</i>
universally	By everyone; in every case. <i>Progress is not always universally welcomed.</i>
<u>usual</u>	Habitually or typically occurring or done; customary. <i>The usual greeting.</i>
usually	Under normal conditions; generally. <i>He usually arrives home about one o'clock.</i>
<u>wont</u>	An established custom. <i>Sons wont to nurse their Parents in old age.</i>
